



Dear Mr. Pfundstein:

Thank you for the package that you forwarded, both electronically and by hard copy, containing your responses to the Committee requests. I have reviewed those responses and would ask that you file some supplemental responsive information.

1. Request No. 1 sought deeds demonstrating ownership of land and buildings at the meter station in Concord, New Hampshire. You provided a plot plan which was apparently part of the FERC submittal for this project. The plot plan references a single deed from Book 1712 Page 27. Would you kindly forward that deed, and any other deeds, that apply to the property.

2. With respect to Request No. 2, you informed the Committee that the nearest fire hydrant was located .2 miles north of the Concord station. Would you kindly provide us with a reference by address or a depiction of where the fire hydrant is located with respect to the meter station.


3. With respect to Request No. 3, you were asked to provide a written explanation of the manner in which LNG would be used to alleviate loss of service associated with construction of the proposed project. The question arose as a result of comments made by the Applicant's representatives at the site visit and public hearing. The answer appears to indicate that liquid natural gas will not be used to alleviate any loss of service associated with the construction of the project at either the Concord facility or the Pelham site. If this is not the case, and LNG will be used at either facility, please provide a written explanation of the manner in which it will be so used.



Request No. 2. A reference by address or a depiction of the fire hydrant that is nearest to Tennessee's Concord meter station.

Response: The nearest fire hydrant is located at the intersection of Broken Bridge Road (south side) and Manchester Street (west side).

Response: Tennessee confirms that use of LNG is not expected for either the Pelham or Concord work. If that expectation changes as Tennessee finalizes its joint plans with Energy North and Granite Ridge, Tennessee will promptly notify the Committee.
