Dear Chairman Burack:

Enclosed find the Application of Tennessee Gas Pipeline Company for a Certificate of Site and Facility – Concord Lateral Expansion Project (“Application”). To meet growing demand in New England, Energy North Natural Gas, Inc. d/b/a KeySpan Energy Delivery New England (“Energy North”), a New Hampshire corporation and Tennessee Gas Pipeline Company (“Tennessee”) have entered into an agreement that will allow Tennessee to provide incremental capacity to the region (“Agreement”). The Agreement was approved by the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission in Docket DG 07-101 by Order No. 24,825 dated February 29, 2008. To provide this capacity, Tennessee plans to construct and operate a new 6,130 horsepower compressor station on its line 200 system, the Concord Lateral system (“Lateral”) in Pelham, New Hampshire, that will allow Tennessee to provide an incremental 30,000 Dth/day of capacity to Energy North. Tennessee will also upgrade its existing Laconia Meter Station in Concord, New Hampshire, with piping modifications to accommodate the additional capacity. The anticipated in-service date is November 1, 2009. Construction would need to be scheduled to commence during or about April 2009.

Tennessee has operated facilities in New Hampshire through its Lateral system since the early 1950s transporting natural gas from Dracut, Massachusetts, into southern New Hampshire. Tennessee provides transportation service for Energy North Natural Gas, Inc., a local distribution company to delivery points in New Hampshire. This system was originally constructed in 1951 and upgraded in the 1980s, the early 1990s, and in 2001.

We also enclose the pre-filed testimony of Michael Stokdyk and Charles Malcolm in support of the Application. The Application and pre-filed Testimony were prepared by a multidisciplinary team of professionals on behalf of Tennessee.


