

TESTIMONY OF WILL STAATS AND JILLIAN KELLY ON BEHALF OF THE NEW HAMPSHIRE
DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME

FEBRUARY 24, 2009

The supplemental testimony of Fish and Game Department employees William Staats
and Jillian Kelly is as follows:

Is there anything in your original prefiled testimony that you would like to change or amend?

Yes. F&G anticipates signing an Agreement with AMC and GRP by which GRP will amend its
application to include an expanded mitigation package. With this amendment, F&G believes
that the impacts of the project will be adequately mitigated by perpetual easements on, or fee
transfers of, other high elevation parcels, by cash payments for studying the impacts of the
project on wildlife and for purchasing other conservation parcels. Once the Agreement is signed
and the amendment is submitted to the Site Evaluation Committee, F&G will submit an
additional statement in support of the mitigation package.
