I have just learned of the proposed wind farm on Tenney and Fletcher Mountains. We have been property owners on Tenney Mountain in Plymouth for 18 years. I know this project has been in discussion for months, but the first we heard of it was this past week. I wish our Board of Directors had brought this to the attention of all homeowners, but they did not.

Many of us do not live in Plymouth full time, but rather enjoy our homes on Tenney Mountain on a part-time basis as a vacation destination. We do, however, pay the same real estate taxes as permanent residences and like to think that our "voices" are as important.

I don't know exactly where the proposed project is in terms of actualization, but I must register a very, loud protest. It is not necessary to tell me about all the 'benefits' propagandized by Iberdrola. I am more concerned about how this project will destroy what we, and many others, have come to love.


Installation of these twenty-four towers reaching upwards of 400 feet will not only be an eye sore for the entire area, but ...

- ... the wind turbine noise will be deafening
- ... the red pulsating lights will ruin the nighttime skyline
- ... birds, bats and in particular the Peregrine Falcon, will be destroyed
- ... potential fire hazard from the turbines is a real concern
- ... property values will plummet

The fact that Iberdrola, which has already received \$577 million in Federal stimulus money, will realize an incomprehensible profit from this project is not as much a concern as the fact that less than one percent of our power would come from this project. The surges on the grid will have to be mixed with reliable power in order for the supply to be stable. Even if you put the potential environmental impact aside, you must realize there is no energy benefit to this project at all.

I beg you to please do the "right" thing .... stop this project!
