

Dear Senator Forrester:

This responds to the concerns expressed in your March 31, 2014 letter to the New Hampshire Site Evaluation Committee. Iberdrola Renewables and Groton Wind strongly believe that your letter does not in fact reflect the progress we have made to date on issues pending before the SEC, or the accuracy of the ongoing conversations with the State Fire Marshal's office, Public Counsel and the other Interveners in this proceeding.

As a matter of fact, we have reached settlement agreements with the landowners adjacent to our operations and maintenance building, we have facilitated a site visit for the Fire Marshal in order to identify and remedy all open concerns with building codes, and we are in active discussions with the Fire Marshal, Public Counsel, and the Buttolph, Lewis, Springs intervener group. A majority of the issues raised during the building inspection have been corrected and are pending the Fire Marshal's inspection of these items. Issues requiring third party contractors are in progress and being closely managed to ensure timely completion.

As for the allegation that we are renegeing on an agreement to allow an interveners' representative on the project site, to clarify any misunderstanding, we want to affirm that we would allow such a visit but not during the time while the independent surveyor is working.

Iberdrola Renewables and Groton Wind take public safety questions very seriously and we are working diligently and closely with the interveners, including the Fire Marshal, the Public Counsel and other Interveners to bring these matters to a swift resolution.
