Dear Mr. Burack,

I request that the State of New Hampshire Site Evaluation Committee rule against the Petition for Jurisdiction Over Renewable Energy Facility as requested by Antrim Wind Energy LLC.

The town of Antrim has a fully developed Zoning Ordinance. Jurisdiction over the Antrim Wind Energy LLC project is a matter for local control. On March 8, 2011, the Antrim voters elected a new planning board who are developing local procedures and zoning ordinances for wind energy projects. I request that the SEC allow the local residents to actively participate in this process.

I am a direct abutter to this proposed industrial wind facility. The Longgood family purchased 89 acres in 1972 with the “benefit of covenants, restrictions, reservations, conditions, rights of approval and easements as set forth in a Declaration of Protective Covenants and Restrictions by Land Vest Properties.” (These restrictions expired after the purchase of the land) The spirit and intent of this was to protect the rural nature of the land which is consistent with the current rural conservation zoning that the North Branch residents of Antrim currently enjoy.


I now own 50 acres of land and enjoy the abundant wildlife, peaceful environment and peaceful quietude of my property. The proposed sighting of the above referenced proposed project would negatively impact the environment, wildlife, and quality of life of the individuals who chose to live in this region. I am a supporter of alternative energy that is suitably sited. In this particular case, I believe that this block of land is not suitable for an industrial project. The negative environmental impact would not be offset

by potential benefits. This project would have a direct impact on the quality of my life and pursuit of health and happiness. My home is at ground zero to this project and I could potentially have multiple turbines surrounding my land. This is not consistent with the reason that I have remained a long term resident and tax payer living in the North Branch area of Antrim and I am opposed to this project.

I request that the SEC rule against the petition for Jurisdiction and return the discussion to the Antrim residents and voters.
