

MOTION TO INTERVENE *PRO SE* OF Annie Law

Pursuant to the New Hampshire Site Evaluation Committee Rules Site 202.11, Annie Law hereby moves for permission to intervene *pro se* in the above-referenced proceeding. In support of her Motion to Intervene, Annie Law offers the following arguments:

(1.) Annie Law can demonstrate a substantial interest which may be affected by the outcome of the proceeding.

I built my home on 43 Farmstead Rd., Antrim, NH in 1988, for the peace and beauty of this rural area. My main concern in regard to the proposed renewable energy facility is that my home is less than 1.5 miles from Tuttle Mt., directly in my view shed and I believe I will be affected by the noise and I'm very concerned about how it will affect my health. I have been an appellant in the proceedings before the Antrim Zoning Board of Adjustments, as well as an intervener when AWE and the Antrim Board of Selectmen applied to the SEC to take jurisdiction of the Antrim Wind Energy project in the Spring of 2011. I feel that my property value will be greatly reduced in value if the project is constructed and I don't want to see the Rural Conservation District destroyed.

(2.) The interest of Annie Law will not be adequately protected by other parties.

In exercising its discretion, I respectfully ask that the Committee consider whether the party's interest will be adequately protected by other parties. Since I, as a resident of the North Branch region of Antrim where the proposed wind facility would be constructed, do not feel that my interests and concerns have been addressed thus far in proceedings by the Selectmen and Planning Board of Antrim, I do not believe that any other party to this proceeding can adequately represent my interests in proceedings before the Committee.

(3.) The intervention of Annie Law will be in the interest of justice and will not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings by allowing the intervention.

Pursuant to the SEC Order of March 20, 2012, Annie Law files this Motion to Intervene by the deadline set forth by the Committee for Docket 2012-01 and requests that I be permitted to intervene with full standing to participate in all phases and activities of the proceeding. I respect the importance of conducting this proceeding in an orderly manner that will not unduly delay the Committee or the parties in reaching an outcome. I am prepared to work closely with other parties to the proceeding in the interest of maintaining order and respectfully offer that my participation, if permitted, would be in the interest of justice.
