Dear Ms. Murray,

I write to express my grave concern about Eolian Wind apparently continuing to attempt to get an industrial-scale wind project going in Antrim, even after you have clearly denied their permit application.

In a recent article, I see that they are billing themselves a leaders in renewable energy across New England. Excuse me? Eolian Wind has never put up a single project anywhere. Their behavior in the the NEK of VT, pertaining to their application for a large project, and 4 MET towers here, (in Newark, Brighton, and Ferdinand), has been blatantly and repeatedly grossly dishonest. They always seem to have a way to get around every complaint..... Jack Kenworthy initially said that they would leave a town, if the town had a vote, that voted "no" on their project. Newark, and also Ferdinand did EXACTLY that ! A significant majority of both of those towns are admantly opposed to industrial wind there, and voted that way. Well, then, Jack Kenworthy, decided to say that what he really meant was that the towns would have to vote on the exact proposed project, which he claimed had not yet been proposed. He says if the towns vote "no" against THAT, then yes, Eolian / Seneca Mountain Wind, would leave. Sure. Anyway, they actually HAD already presented their full project to each town, with maps, photos, films, etc. These boys are bad news. The town officials in any of the three above mentioned towns have had a terrible time with them.

The town of Newark's attorney fees are somewhere around \$70,000. Newark Neighbors United has paid out at least \$8000 to their attorney. SMW is involved in a lawsuit against the town of Frankfort, ME, because Frankfort decided to create a new ordinance against industrial wind. I strongly encourage you to hold firm in your original decision, sending Eolian Wind, on their way. In so doing, you may indeed save the town of Antrim, and the state of NH, alot of time, and alot of money.

There has never been a nuclear or coal burning plant, anywhere in the world, that has been shut down because of industrial wind projects. IW is inefficient, intermittent, prohibitively expensive energy that does not do what the wind industry says it does. IW is appropriate in some places, such as the midwest wind tunnel, Texas, etc. However, it is not appropriate for NH, VT, or ME.....and is coming to these states, as well as places ALL OVER THE WORLD, only because of massive government subsidies. But wait a minute.... aren't we in a recession ? Go figure.
