

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Site Evaluation Committee for the State of New Hampshire shall conduct a Public Meeting and Hearing on JUNE 1, 2012, at the Offices of the Public Utilities Commission, 21 South Fruit Street, Concord, N.H. The agenda for said Public Meeting and Hearing shall include:

AGENDA ITEM NO 1: Docket No. 2012-02: Motion of Granite State Gas Transmission Company for a Declaratory Ruling Regarding the Little Bay Bridge Crossing Project between Newington, Rockingham County and Dover, Strafford County, New Hampshire

The Proceeding On April 3, 2012, Granite State Gas Transmission Company (GS&T) filed a Motion for Declaratory Ruling Regarding the Little Bay Bridge Crossing Project between Newington and Dover, New Hampshire (Motion). On June 1, 2012, at 10 o'clock a.m. the Site Evaluation Committee (Committee) shall review the Motion and hear argument from GS&T and any other parties. Immediately thereafter, the Committee may deliberate and rule on the merits of the Motion or order further review.

The Proposed Facility GS&T owns and operates a bi-directional high pressure pipeline (492 psig MAOP) that transports natural gas between Haverhill, Massachusetts and Portland, Maine. The pipeline contains a tie-in of 10 inch pipe that consists of buried pipe on either side of Little Bay channel and crosses over Little Bay channel between Newington and Dover New Hampshire. The tie-in is suspended below the Little Bay Bridge, U.S. Route 16 and the Spaulding Turnpike. The pipeline segment suspended below the bridge is approximately 1,500 feet in length.

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDPOT) plans to remove the existing Little Bay Bridge and to construct a new bridge as part of the Newington-Dover Project No. 11238. GS&T will not be permitted to re-locate the pipeline underneath or along the new bridge. GS&T has been informed that the existing pipeline will need to be removed before mid-2013 to allow for the removal of the existing bridge.

GS&T proposes to replace the existing pipeline with an underground 10-inch diameter steel pipe that will be approximately 2,500 feet in length and sit in bedrock 30 feet below the bed of the Little Bay channel and Piscataqua River. GS&T proposes to install the replacement pipe through the use of horizontal directional drilling. The replacement pipe will run parallel to the Little Bay Bridge and enter and exit the river bed on state owned property administered by NHDPOT. The Dover tie-in would be located within Hilton Park. The Newington tie-in would be located in the area of Shattuck Way.

The Motion GS&T requests that the Committee issue a declaratory ruling pursuant to New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules, Site 203.01 and RSA 541-A: 1, V, finding that the construction and operation of the proposed replacement pipeline does not constitute a sizeable addition to an existing bulk power facility and therefore does not require a certificate of site and facility under RSA 162-H: 5, II.

The Motion seeks an expedited determination. Public Inspection and Intervention Additional details concerning the proposed project and all other correspondence, filings, and public records regarding this matter including the Motion are available for public inspection at the Office of the Chairman of the Committee located at the Department of Environmental Services, 29 Hazen Drive, Concord, New Hampshire. The Motion and Objection, and other correspondence regarding this matter may also be available at http://www.nhsec.nh.gov/current.htm.



MAINE'S SLOPPY GOP CONVENTION HURTS SENATE HOPEFULS

PORTLAND, Maine — Maine's messy GOP convention denied much-needed exposure for six Senate candidates who are hoping to break away from the pack, and the party's deep divisions that were on display could play into independent Senate candidate Angus King's complaint that the major parties are broken.

The GOP convention was commandeered by Ron Paul activists whose battle with Mitt Romney supporters took up the time allotted for the Senate candidates.

Denied a spot at the podium, Senate hopefuls who'd refined their 20-minute speeches and created video presentations were relegated to speaking to small groups of supporters in empty meeting rooms or in stairwells Sunday at the Augusta Civic Center.

Candidate Scott D'Amboise, who ended up standing on a chair to address 100 support-

ers, said all the candidates were frustrated.

"It hurts us all," he said. "A lot of people come to conventions having not made up their minds yet. We now have to work 10 times harder."

It was a convention that will be talked about for years to come.

Paul's supporters installed their own convention chairman and won 21 out of 24 delegates to the national convention even though Paul finished a close second behind Romney in Maine's nonbinding presidential caucuses. Romney supporters cried foul, and both sides traded accusations of misconduct.

The divided convention and ugly accusations may play to the advantage of King, who says that both major parties are polarized and that the state needs an independent who can bridge the gap to get things accomplished, said Mark Brewer, a political scientist at the Uni-

versity of Maine.

"If you're looking at this from the outside, it just gives you the impression that the Republican Party in Maine is a mess," Brewer said.

King, who declined to comment Monday, will face Republican and Democratic challengers from a field of 10 who are seeking their parties' nominations for the opportunity to vie for Republican U.S. Sen. Olympia Snowe's soon-to-be empty seat.

The conventions are important for candidates because it gives them an opportunity to address the party's loyal members who are likely to vote.

Two years ago, then-Waterville Mayor Paul LePage's strong showing of support at the convention in Portland underscored momentum that carried him to victory in the governor's race.

Sandy Maisel, director of the Goldfarb Center for Public Affairs at Colby College, said the weekend convention "sort of defies rational explanation

about how a political party is supposed to function to me. Isn't the role of the political party to aid its candidates?"

Senate candidate Rick Bennett, a Republican National Committeeman who's a Romney supporter, said that the convention was a sloppy affair and that he would have preferred to have spoken from the podium to the 2,800 people who registered for the convention. But he said the Ron Paul supporters are bringing new energy to the party that will be helpful down the road.

"Democracy is messy. It's better than coronations," Bennett said in reference to King, the two-term governor who has assumed front-runner status.

Among independents, King is the only candidate who has filed his nominating petitions to appear on the ballot. Others, such as tea party activist Andrew Ian Dodge and Yarmouth Town Council Chairman Steve Woods, who are mounting independent Senate bids, have until June 1 to file their petitions with the secretary of state.

University campus alerted after report of assault

DURHAM (AP) — The University of New Hampshire Police Department is investigating a report that a student was sexually assaulted in her dorm room by a stranger.

University spokeswoman Erika Mantz said the student reported being assaulted around 3:30 a.m. Sunday in Stoke Hall. The alleged victim did not know the assailant, whom she described as dark skinned with dark hair and wearing a dark shirt.

Authorities have not said whether the student was injured. No arrests have been made, and UNH police released no further details Monday.

They encourage anyone with information to call the UNH Police Department at 862-1427.

The campus community was notified of the assault through an emergency text message, as required under the federal Clery Act, a campus crime-reporting law. According to the most recent statistics collected under that law, there were 49 reports of forcible sexual assault at campuses across the state in 2010, including 12 at the University of New Hampshire, the state's largest university, with approximately 15,000 students. That was up from eight in 2008 and 10 in 2009.

Dartmouth College, with about 6,000 students, also had 12 reports of forcible sexual assault in 2010, compared with 22 in 2008 and 10 in 2009.

A year ago, Vice President Joe Biden chose the University of New Hampshire as the backdrop for a new initiative aimed at reminding colleges and universities of their responsibility to prevent sexual violence. UNH was chosen for the announcement because of its highly regarded violence prevention efforts and victim support services, including 24-hour victim assistance.

Nearly 20 percent of female college students will be victims of attempted or actual sexual assault, as will about 6 percent of undergraduate men, according to data provided by the Education Department.

The Proceeding

On April 3, 2012, Granite State Gas Transmission Company (GSST) filed a Motion for Declaratory Ruling Regarding the Little Bay Bridge Crossing Project between Newington and Dover, New Hampshire (Motion). On June 1, 2012, at 10 o'clock a.m. the Site Evaluation Committee (Committee) shall review the Motion and hear argument from GSST and any other parties. Immediately thereafter, the Committee may deliberate and rule on the merits of the Motion or order further review.

The Proposed Facility

GSST owns and operates a bi-directional high pressure pipeline (492 psig MAOP) that transports natural gas between Haverhill, Massachusetts and Portland, Maine. The pipeline contains a tie-in of 10 inch pipe that consists of buried pipe on either side of Little Bay channel and crosses over Little Bay channel between Newington and Dover New Hampshire. The tie-in is suspended below the Little Bay Bridge, U.S. Route 15 and the Spaulding Turnpike. The pipeline segment suspended below the bridge is approximately 1,500 feet in length.

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation (NHDOT) plans to remove the existing Little Bay Bridge and to construct a new bridge as part of the Newington-Dover Project No. 11238. GSST will not be permitted to re-locate the pipeline underneath or along the new bridge. GSST has been informed that the existing pipeline will need to be removed before mid-2013 to allow for the removal of the existing bridge.

GSST proposes to replace the existing pipeline with an underground 10-inch diameter steel pipe that will be approximately 2,500 feet in length and sit in bedrock 30 feet below the bed of the Little Bay channel and Piscataquis River. GSST proposes to install the replacement pipe through the use of horizontal directional drilling. The replacement pipe will run parallel to the Little Bay Bridge and enter and exit the river bed on state owned property administered by NHDOT. The Dover tie-in would be located within Hilton Park. The Newington tie-in would be located in the area of Shattuck Way.

The Motion

GSST requests that the Committee issue a declaratory ruling pursuant to New Hampshire Code of Administrative Rules, Site 203.01 and RSA 541-A: 1, V, finding that the construction and operation of the proposed replacement pipeline does not constitute a sizable addition to an existing bulk power facility and therefore does not require a certificate of site and facility under RSA 162-H: 5, II.

The Motion seeks an expedited determination.



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
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
