1	PROCEEDING	
2	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Good morning,	
3	everyone. We're here in SEC Docket 2014-04, maybe for the	
4	last time. We have to deal with JLCAR's approval of the	
5	rules as they were submitted following the Preliminary	
6	Objection. And, at that time, JLCAR filed a petition for	
7	us to open a rulemaking specifically on the suspension and	
8	revocation rules, and the issues that OLS identified with	
9	our version of those rules.	
10	So, we'll deal with both of those items	
11	this morning. Before we do that, let's identify who's	
12	here today.	
13	COMMISSIONER SCOTT: Good morning. I'm	
14	Bob Scott, with the New Hampshire Public Utilities	
15	Commission.	
16	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Martin Honigberg	
17	with the Public Utilities Commission.	
18	DIRECTOR MUZZEY: Elizabeth Muzzey with	
19	the Department of Cultural Resources.	
20	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Kate Bailey with	
21	the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission.	
22	MS. ROBERGE: Michele Roberge with the	
23	New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services.	
24	CMSR. ROSE: Good morning. Jeff Rose,

1	Commissioner of the Department of Resources & Economic
2	Development.
3	MR. HAWK: Roger Hawk, public member.
4	MR. OLDENBURG: Bill Oldenburg,
5	Department of Transportation.
6	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: I'll note for the
7	record that Mr. Oldenburg is here as a designee of the
8	Commissioner of the Department of Transportation,
9	Ms. Roberge is here as a designee of the Commissioner of
10	the Department of Environmental Services.
11	Mr. Wiesner, you want to help us with
12	specifically what we need to do with the rules as JLCAR
13	approved them.
14	MR. WIESNER: Well, as you noted,
15	Mr. Chairman, the JLCAR approved the revised rules as they
16	were submitted in response to the Preliminary Objections.
17	And, that approval was without further objection. So,
18	that permits the Committee now to adopt these as final
19	rules that will be filed, hopefully, today, and become
20	effective tomorrow.
21	The text of these rules that you have
22	before you are virtually identical to what was approved by
23	JLCAR. I do want to point out one change, which is an
24	editorial change. And, this appears in the 300 rules, on

1	Pages 8 and 9. And, this is an editorial change that we
2	made in response to a comment from the Office of
3	Legislative Services' staff.
4	This is in Site 301.05(b), Section
5	Subsection (7), regarding photosimulations. It was a long
6	paragraph. What now appears as (8) used to be part of
7	(7). But it does help, in my view, and they also, to
8	break it out. And, have a shorter paragraph in
9	Subsection (7), and then (8) has the longer list of
10	specific requirements. And, then, as we turn to Page 9,
11	that required renumbering of Subparagraphs (9) and (10).
12	So, that's the only change. Other than
13	that, with all changes accepted, this is the text of the
14	rules as they were submitted to JLCAR and approved by
15	JLCAR.
16	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Is the
17	rearrangement of the sections, breaking those items that
18	used to be part of (7) into what is now (8), did any of
19	the language change?
20	MR. WIESNER: None of the language has
21	changed. It's a purely editorial change in terms of
22	numbering.
23	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: And, this does not
24	in any way violate the complicated JLCAR processes and the

1	Rulemaking Manual to make an editorial change like this in	
2	response to an OLS comment?	
3	MR. WIESNER: No. Editorial changes	
4	such as this do not require JLCAR approval. And, this is	
5	specifically responsive to a comment made by the Office of	
6	Legislative Services. And, the Manual is clear that, when	
7	you file adopted rules, as we will later today, you just	
8	note the editorial change that was made, and our cover	
9	letter will do so.	
10	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right. Does	
11	anyone have any questions or comments?	
12	[No verbal response]	
13	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: So, Mr. Wiesner, I	
14	need a motion to approve the rules at this time?	
15	MR. WIESNER: To adopt the rules.	
16	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Adopt, okay.	
17	COMMISSIONER SCOTT: I so move.	
18	DIRECTOR MUZZEY: Second.	
19	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Is there any	
20	further discussion?

22	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Seeing none, all in	
23	favor say "aye"?

1 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Are there any 2 opposed? 3 [No verbal response] 4 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Okay. The "ayes" 5 have it. 6 Now, with respect to the petition that 7 JLCAR sent to us, to open a rulemaking on the revocation 8 and suspension rules, what are our options and obligations 9 here, Mr. Wiesner? 10 MR. WIESNER: There was -- and, this is 11 an instance where we included in the rules the word "may", 12 and JLCAR and OLS prefer the word "shall", with specific 13 criteria noted, in order to limit agency discretion in 14 what would otherwise be permissive actions taken pursuant 15 to the statutory language. They were willing to approve 16 these rules for final adoption by the Committee without 17 objection, but we did receive this petition for a 18 rulemaking. 19 Like any other petition for a 20 rulemaking, the Committee actually has the authority to 21 reject the petition and not take any action, or to address 22 it through a rulemaking initiative. And, in that regard, 23 if that's the course that the Committee chooses to take, there seem to be two options: Either a completely 24 {SEC 2014-04} [Meeting on Adoption of Rules] {12-15-15}

1 separate rulemaking undertaking, a separate docket that 2 would address only this change, specific criteria for 3 revocation or suspension of certificates; or, it could be 4 included in the rulemaking that will be initiated in the 5 coming year with regard to pipeline siting, as required by 6 Section 10(b) of 162-H. 7 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Now, I know this makes you unhappy, Mr. Wiesner, but that rulemaking is not 8 9 on your desk, as far as I know. I know you're going to 10 miss that. But that one I think is being handled by 11 Ms. Monroe. 12 Ms. Monroe, can you give us where we --13 information about where we are on the gas rulemaking that 14 we're required to be doing by statute? 15 ADMINISTRATOR MONROE: So, I've been in 16 the process of reviewing these rules, to determine what 17 areas of this rulemaking would parallel with the statutory 18 requirement for the pipeline siting rules, and then 19 determine what other provisions we need to adopt. And, 20 we'll probably go through a very similar process, where we 21 request comments from the public, as to the provisions 22 that should be in those rules, to kick off that rulemaking 23 process. I'm hoping to have that started by Friday of 24 this week.

1 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Does anyone -- does 2 either of you, or Mr. Iacopino, Attorney Iacopino who's 3 here as well, have any thoughts or recommendations as 4 whether, assuming we want to take on a rulemaking, whether 5 it makes more sense to do it as a separate rulemaking or 6 roll it into the gas rulemaking? And, the "it" in that 7 sentence is the consideration of the rule on suspension and revocation. 8 MR. WIESNER: The only real difference I 9 10 can think of is that, you know, the pipeline rules are 11 going to be quite a bit more involved than the specific criteria for suspension or revocation. And, therefore, it 12 13 might be possible to adopt rules that address JLCAR's 14 petition more quickly, sooner, have those rules in place, 15 if it's a separate rulemaking, rather than if it's 16 included in the pipeline siting rulemaking. But, you 17 know, the formal process takes a certain amount of time 18 regardless, and it's a matter of a couple months maybe. 19 So, I think the timing is the primary 20 consideration. But, balanced against that, you know, the 21 potential greater efficiency of having two rulemakings 22 going at the same time. 23 CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: And, if we're 24 trying -- if one is moving faster than the other, there is {SEC 2014-04} [Meeting on Adoption of Rules] {12-15-15}

1	a distinct possibility of needing this group to come
2	together multiple times, additional types, is there not?
3	COMMISSIONER SCOTT: There may be
4	opportunities to double up, if you will. But, yes,
5	theoretically, that could require additional meetings of
6	the Committee.
7	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Does anyone have
8	any thoughts on either the basic question of whether to
9	take this issue on, we are allowed to say "no", and, if we
10	do choose to take it on, how we should proceed?
11	Commissioner Bailey.
12	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: Thank you. I
13	think we should take it on, because JLCAR has asked us to.
14	And, I think, given the work that the Committee has to do
15	in the coming year, with all of the siting cases that we
16	have, it would be more efficient to combine the two into
17	one rulemaking.
18	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: Other thoughts or
19	comments from members of the Committee?
20	[No verbal response]
21	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All right. I'm
22	going to construe I'm going to do this in two pieces.
23	Going to construe Commissioner Bailey's statement first as
24	a motion to basically grant the petition from JLCAR to

2	And, then, we'll take separately a consideration of doing

7	process, and since then, have commented to me on the great	
8	work that Attorney Wiesner did in putting this together,	
9	and listening to everyone, and accommodating people's	
10	reasonable requests, and even some of their unreasonable	
11	requests, for assistance in this regard. I don't think	
12	this would have happened without him, and we, I think, all	
13	can't thank him enough.	
14	So, with that, I'll entertain a motion	
15	to adjourn?	
16	COMMISSIONER BAILEY: So moved.	
17	COMMISSIONER SCOTT: Second.	
18	CHAIRMAN HONIGBERG: All in favor say	
19	"aye"?	
20	[Multiple members indicating "aye".]
