**Notice of Public Information Session**

Pursuant to RSA 162-H:10, Antrim Wind Energy, LLC (“AWE”) will hold a public information session on March 26, 2015 at 7:00 o’clock p.m. at the Antrim Town Hall, 66 Main Street, Antrim, New Hampshire to present information regarding a proposed nine (9) turbine wind energy facility (the “Facility”) to be located in Antrim and for which AWE intends to submit an Application for a Certificate of Site and Facility pursuant to RSA 162-H:7. The hearing shall be recorded and members of the public shall be permitted to give public comment.

**Nature and Location of the Proposed Facility**

The Facility is proposed to be located on and adjacent to property at 354 Keene Road (N.H. Route 9) in Antrim on approximately 1,870 acres of private lands leased to AWE. The lands occupy the area in Antrim from Route 9, southward to the east summit of Tuttle Hill, and to the north flank of Willard Mountain to the west. The Facility is proposed to be constructed on a ridgeline that starts approximately 0.75 miles south of N.H. Route 9 and runs south-southwest for approximately 2.5 miles. The Facility is proposed to include nine (9) wind turbines capable of generating 3.2 MW each. Turbines 1 through 8 will have a maximum height from foundation to blade tip of 488.8 feet and Turbine 9 will have a maximum height of 446.1 feet. Each turbine will feature a tower, a nacelle, and a three-blade rotor.

In addition, the proposed Facility will include approximately 3.5 miles of new gravel access roads within the project area, a meteorological tower, an electrical collector system consisting of both underground and overhead collection lines, an interconnection substation to be built within a fenced area, and an operations and maintenance building of approximately 3,000 square feet in a 3-acre cleared area located approximately 500 feet off the southern side of Route 9.

AWE proposes to interconnect to an existing Public Service Company of New Hampshire (“PSNH”) 115 kVa electric transmission line through the proposed interconnection substation which will be constructed adjacent to and interconnect with the existing PSNH L-163 115kVa electric transmission line.


