AFFIDAVIT OF BARRY NEEDLEMAN

I, Barry Needleman, being duly sworn, do under oath depose and state as follows:

1. I am a Director at McLane Middleton, Professional Association, which represents Antrim Wind Energy, LLC (“AWE”) in the above captioned matter.

2. AWE intends to construct and operate a 28.8 MW electrical generating facility consisting of nine Siemens SWT 3.2-113 direct drive wind turbines in Antrim, New Hampshire.

3. RSA 162-H:10 requires that AWE, as the applicant for a Certificate of Site and Facility, hold at least one public information session in each county in which the proposed facility will be located within 45 days after acceptance of their Application by the Site Evaluation Committee. In addition, the statute requires that no less than 14 days before the public information session, the Applicant must publish a Public Notice in one or more newspapers having a regular circulation in the county in which the session is to be held.

4. The Statute further requires that not less than 10 days before such session, AWE must provide a copy of the public notice to the presiding officer of the Site Evaluation Committee.


5. In accordance with the Statute, the Public Notice for the Hillsborough County Public Information Session was published in the New Hampshire Union Leader on December 15, 2015 and in the Monadnock Ledger Transcript on December 17, 2015, which is at least 14 days

prior to the session. Copies of the Notice of Public Information Session for Hillsborough County are attached hereto as Exhibit A.

6. As provided in the Notice, a Public Information Session will be held on January 6, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. at the Antrim Town Hall, 66 Main Street, Antrim, NH. The hearing shall be recorded and a moderator will facilitate a question and answer session. Members of the public may also give public comment.



Re: Application of Antrim Wind Energy, LLC for a Certificate of Site and Facility

On October 2, 2015, Antrim Wind Energy, LLC (Antrim Wind), filed an Application for a Certificate of Site and Facility (Application) with the Site Evaluation Committee (Committee). Antrim Wind seeks the issuance of a Certificate of Site and Facility approving the siting, construction, and operation of a 28.8 MW electrical generation facility consisting of nine Siemens SWT-3.2-113 direct drive wind turbines and associated civil and electrical infrastructure. The entire project will be located in the northwest portion of the Town of Antrim.

On October 20, 2015, pursuant to RSA 162-H:4-a, the Chairman of the Committee appointed a Subcommittee in this docket. On December 1, 2015 the Subcommittee issued an order finding that the Application contained sufficient information to carry out the purposes of RSA 162-H. The purpose of this Order is to set forth a procedural schedule so that this docket may proceed in accordance with the requirements of RSA 162-H.

RSA 162-H:10, 1-a, requires that within 45 days after acceptance of an application for a certificate, that the Applicant hold at least one public information session in each county where the proposed facility will be located. The purpose of the public information session is to provide the public with information on the proposed Project, to provide an opportunity for comments and questions from the public, and to explain the process the Subcommittee will follow in reviewing the application. Robert R. Scott, the presiding officer of the Subcommittee, has designated Counsel to the Committee, Michael Iacopino as the presiding officer for the public information session.
