Ms. Monroe:

The Gregg Lake Association (GLA) has been in existence since the 1960's. Its by-laws state that it was established for the "conservation and protection of the lake, forests, woodlands, marshlands and wildlife surrounding Gregg Lake" and to "promote the responsible and equitable use and enjoyment of Gregg Lake by property owners and town residents". Membership is open "to any person or persons who have a strong and vital interest in the conservation of Gregg Lake and its watershed".

The GLA consists of more than 40 member families, most of whom are seasonal residents. Several families, however, are year-round. Several of the homes on or near the lake are more than a century old. Many are owned by generations of the same family who, like their predecessors, seek out the lake environment for its beauty, peace and quiet, and natural wildlife. Given that the bulk of the membership is seasonal, however, does not minimize the concerns of the members. In fact, GLA members voted unanimously at the annual meeting on June 16, 2012 to act as a group and petition to intervene in the AWE's first project (with none opposed and two abstentions). We were successful.

A year later, after the AWE project had been denied by the SEC, and at its June 15, 2013 GLA meeting, members voted overwhelmingly to let the SEC findings stand and not reopen the case for an Antrim wind farm.

Now that the Antrim Wind Energy project has been re-opened, and is once again before the SEC, members of the GLA acted favorably on a motion at its latest meeting of August 27, 2016. The 21 member households in attendance unanimously passed a motion to resubmit the letter we drafted to the SEC in 2013 (attached), reaffirming our opposition to the project. It is the GLA's view that the changes proposed by AWE do not represent a significant modification of the original proposal. Therefore, our position on this matter remains unchanged.

Dear Chairperson Ignatius and the SEC Committee Members,

At the June 15, 2013 meeting of the Gregg Lake Association (GLA), a motion was passed that the GLA vote on whether to support or not support the proposed AWE wind farm. Made up of members who have been following the proceedings carefully via the SEC website, the GLA members were ready to make a decision when a member proposed a motion.

Members who attended, and members who were not at the meeting, were contacted and asked for their vote. The results of the voting were: five (5) votes for the AWE wind farm, twenty-three (23) votes against the AWE wind farm, and two (2) abstentions. Each family was entitled to one vote. According to the GLA by-laws, the number voting was within the quorum needed.

The Gregg Lake Association therefore urges to let stand the earlier SEC decision and requests that the matter not be re-opened.
