Although I am not a resident of Antrim, I am a resident of New Hampshire and write to you in full support of Antrim Wind Energy. Antrim, NH has the resources available to produce wind energy, and I believe that our state should utilize that resource. I understand many people have concerns that the AWE will disrupt the conservation lands that currently exist. AWE has shown that it not only considers, but actually *cares* about conserving the land surround the wind project. According to the SEC's findings, the Antrim Wind project would effect less than 1% of the conserved land. The AWE project will conserve approximately 908 acres of land, which should be considered a significant amount of land. This 908 acres will be permanently conserved thanks to Antrim Wind Energy, even after their wind energy project may no longer exist.

Antrim Wind also provided \$100,000 to the New England Forestry Foundation to conserve additional land in this area.
