

Hi Pam,

I understand that the Antrim Wind project is headed into deliberations in front of the SEC starting December 7<sup>th</sup>. I wanted to take a moment to write to you in support of this important clean energy project. My understanding is that from the beginning, this project has engaged stakeholders, listened to concerns and made concessions where possible. The project has tremendous support statewide. NH has limited energy resources, with the majority of energy being produced from the burning of fossil fuels. We now understand that this is not a sustainable approach to energy creation b/c of climate change, and it's not helpful to the NH economy to produce our energy using fuel that comes from out of state or from other countries. Antrim provides a unique opportunity to produce 28 MW's of clean, renewable energy right here in NH. It's exciting to me that this project makes financial sense without any incentives from the state of NH.

As is the case with projects of this scale, there will always be some amount of legitimate concern and also some amount of NIMBYism. My understanding is that this project has continuously rolled up its sleeves and worked with stakeholders to hear their concerns and make changes where appropriate. I feel that this is a very important project for our state. The scale alone is unique. The largest solar array in NH right now is 1MW, and there are only a couple of solar projects this size. Antrim provides our state with a unique opportunity to actually move the needle on clean energy in a substantial way. My concern is that if a project like this, which has acted responsibly and made concessions wherever possible, is not approved, it will send the wrong message to clean energy developers who are considering developing similar projects in our state.
