Dear Ms. Monroe:

The purpose of this letter is to object to the August 1, 2016 request by Eversource Energy to group Fat Dog Shellfish Co LLC with The Nature Conservancy (TNC) and the Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), thereby limiting our participation in the site evaluation proceedings. Among this group, Fat Dog Shellfish is the only private, for-profit entity. We are also the only intervening entity that stands to lose short and long term revenue, as well as the inventory (live oysters) that serve as the basis for our company, in the event of water quality and sedimentation impacts from the proposed project.

The applicant incorrectly states in its proposed grouping that "these petitioners are generally concerned about same or similar issues, namely the project's potential impact to the Great Bay Estuary and Little Bay." To clarify, Fat Dog Shellfish is concerned about the direct impact of this project on the quality and survival of our product. This project has the potential to create significant financial hardship to Fat Dog Shellfish. This concern is unique from those of TNC and CLF.
