## PROCEEDINGS

PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Okay. We are going to see if anyone has any objections to any of the exhibits. Attorney Patch, we'll go in our usual order here and start with you.

MR. PATCH: The only objections that we have are the ones that are essentially noted in the motion that we filed jointly with CLF and Newington so I don't expect that you'd address those now but exhibits that were late to the DES filings that came after February 28th really are what they amount to, but other than that, we don't have any.

PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Thank you.
Understood. We will not be addressing that
motion tonight. Attorney Geiger?

MS. GEIGER: Yes, thank you. I don't have any objections to any of the Applicant's exhibits coming into the record, but I would respectfully ask that Applicant's Exhibit 227, the caption or the title of that document be revised to reflect that it isn't Newington's current master plan. It's Newington's 2010/2020 Master Plan with the 2015 Amendment found at the

very end on pages 481 and 482. I just don't 1 2 want the Committee to be misled when they refer to that document or examine it without noting 3 that there has been an amendment, and the 4 5 amendment is in the very, very back of the 6 document. MR. NEEDLEMAN: No objection. 7 MR. IACOPINO: So we'll call that, we're 8 9 just add to that hyphen 2010 dash 2020 with 2015 10 addition. 11 MS. GEIGER: Right. And Mr. Hebert would 12 like the title also to note pages 481 and 482 at the end just to be clear that that's where the 13 14 amendment is found. MR. IACOPINO: Give us that number again? 15 16 MS. GEIGER: Pages 481 and 482. 17 MR. IACOPINO: We'll put that in 18 parentheses at the end of that title. 19 Thank you very much for doing MS. GEIGER: 20 that. 21 PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Attorney Brown? Durham Residents? 22 23 MS. BROWN: No objection to parties' 24 exhibits.

1 PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Sorry, no 2 objections to any exhibits? 3 MS. BROWN: That's correct. 4 PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Thank you. 5 Ms. Mackie? 6 MS. MACKIE: We have no objections to 7 anyone's exhibits. PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Thank you, 8 9 Ms. Mackie. Ms. Frink? 10 MS. BROWN: She was sick and went home. 11 MR. NEEDLEMAN: Madam Chair, I'll note that 12 we did exchange notes with Ms. Frink and told 13 her we didn't object to any of hers and she said 14 she didn't object to any of ours, for what that's worth. 15 16 Thank you. MR. IACOPINO: 17 PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Thank you. 18 Counsel for the Public. 19 MR. ASLIN: I have no objections. I do have a question just to so it's clear on the 20 21 I don't see any of the Joyce Crowley 22 exhibits in the final exhibit list, I presume 23 because they've withdrawn as a party, but I just 24 wanted to make sure that's in the record, how

1 they're treated.

MR. NEEDLEMAN: I was also going to speak to that.

MR. IACOPINO: I guess that's why they're not in there. I didn't actually prepare this myself, but -- so did you have an objection to them not being there or just wanted to note that they're not there?

MR. ASLIN: I don't think I have an objection, and they will appear in the transcript where they're referenced, but I'm not sure that they're necessary given that the party's withdrawn.

MR. NEEDLEMAN: One of our requests was going to be that they be struck, that the agreement that we reached with them resolved all of their concerns related to the Project to their satisfaction so we don't think that that should now be counted as evidence in the proceeding.

MR. IACOPINO: I think we should around and ask if anybody would object to them being struck, and we'll deal with that first, and then what I can do is whether they're stricken or not

we can add them to the list with the appropriate thing next to them and say "stricken" or whatever, just in case somebody is reading the transcript and starts trying to find what are they talking about and then they'll see from the list that it was stricken. But whether or not there's objections to the Motion to Strike, we should go around the room.

PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Attorney Needleman has made a motion to strike the Crowley Joyce Revocable Trust exhibits.

Attorney Patch, do you have any objection?

MR. PATCH: I was just trying to look for their list. I know it's not in the one we got by email, and I just wanted to sort of make sure that, I don't think I asked any questions related to that, but --

ADMINISTRATOR MONROE: I have it that they have Exhibits 1 through 20.

MR. PATCH: I talked briefly with Mr.

Needleman just a couple of minutes ago about whether we should strike the draft of the Durham MOU, but given the fact that it's referred to in the transcript it seemed to make sense to keep

it. So given that kind of view of the Durham Draft MOU I'm just wondering about these exhibits, you know, because I think, Mr. Iacopino, you said there would be some note I guess made in the transcripts, but I just wonder if somebody goes back a few years from now and tries to look at the record and there are no exhibits that have been referred to in the transcript how that will appear.

MR. IACOPINO: No, I wasn't talking about doing anything in the transcript, other than the transcript we're making right now, but in the Master Exhibit List, we would add those exhibits in there with the word "stricken" after them so that there's sort of a master document in the file somebody can refer to if they have questions about those particular exhibits.

MR. PATCH: And would they be able to find them somewhere then?

MR. IACOPINO: Well, they'll be with the Site Evaluation Committee for as long as we're required to retain records. They've already been submitted to us.

MR. PATCH: The actual exhibits will be

1 there? 2 MR. IACOPINO: Yes. 3 Okay. That reassures me then. MR. PATCH: PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: 4 They won't 5 be part of the official record. 6 MR. PATCH: Right, but they'll be somewhere 7 in the file if somebody in the archives looks for them ten years from now. 8 9 MR. IACOPINO: Should be the case, yes. 10 PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: The name of the exhibits will be on list with the word 11 12 "stricken" next to them, but the exhibits will not be part of the record, but if someone wants 13 14 to go hunting them for them, they will be able to find them at the offices of the SEC. 15 16 MR. PATCH: I mean, the only one that gives 17 me a little bit of hesitation, I'm looking at 18 Exhibit 4, JCT Exhibit 4, report of the PUC in 19 order number 5881. I don't remember what that 20 says. 21 ADMINISTRATOR MONROE: JCT 4? 22 MR. PATCH: Yes, Exhibit 4. ADMINISTRATOR MONROE: It looks like it's a 23 24 deed between New Hampshire Electric Company, the

1 Badgers, and the Flynns. 2 MR. IACOPINO: It's actually a PUC report. 3 Actually a PUC report where, it says Petition for the Right-of-Way and it's dated 1951. 4 5 MR. PATCH: I don't know if there's 6 anything in there that historically might be useful so I don't know. That's the only 7 hesitancy I guess I would have. And the things 8 like Exhibit 16, Revised Environmental Map. 9 10 Now, I assume that's the same as what's cited in 11 parentheses or is that a different one? 12 PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Attorney 13 Patch, I think what might be good is we're going to skip you. You can look at these exhibits and 14 15 see if you want them in and you can then 16 advocate for them. 17 MR. PATCH: Okay. 18 PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Attorney 19 Geiger? 20 MS. GEIGER: I have the same issue as 21 Attorney Patch. I need time to look at them to 22 see if there's something of significance to the 23 Town of Newington. Mr. Hebert has concerns 24 about those documents for a couple of different

1 reasons, and so I'd like a minute just to look 2 them over to see what they are and refresh my 3 memory, just to focus in on them. PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: 4 Why don't 5 you take a few minutes to do that as well. 6 ADMINISTRATOR MONROE: Does everybody have Exhibit 1 through 20 Crowley Joyce? Attorney 7 Brown? 8 9 MS. BROWN: I forgot. What was the 10 question? Whether I object to having them I don't. 11 struck? Thank you. 12 PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Do you have any objection to having the Crowley Joyce 13 14 exhibits struck from the record? 15 MS. BROWN: We don't. Thank you. 16 PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Ms. Mackie? 17 MS. MACKIE: We have no objection. 18 PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Mr. Aslin? 19 MR. ASLIN: I don't have any objections 20 either to striking them. I certainly didn't use 21 any of them in my cross-exam so given that the 22 party's withdrawn and those issues have been 23 resolved, I think many of these are public 24 record documents that exist in the world already

1	so I have no objection.
2	PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Attorney
3	Patch?
4	MR. PATCH: Yes. Thank you. I don't have
5	any objection. I think to the extent that the
6	Exhibit 4, JCT Exhibit 4, is a PUC report and
7	order, if I have more time to go through it and
8	think there's something useful there I could ask
9	you to take administrative notice of it. So
10	given that, I think I'll say I had no objection.
11	PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Thank you.
12	Attorney Geiger?
13	MS. GEIGER: I'm having some technical
14	difficulties in accessing these documents for
15	some reason.
16	MR. ASLIN: Can I help?
17	PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Could we
18	help or pull something up for you?
19	MR. HEBERT: It's the photos that he had.
20	PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Exhibit 7?
21	MS. GEIGER: Newington would not object to
22	striking all of the Crowley Joyce exhibits
23	except for JCT number 7 which is shoreline
24	photos showing the Crowley Joyce Revocable Trust

property. I think it's relevant information and the photo speaks for itself, notwithstanding that there was not a witness that adopted it.

MR. IACOPINO: It's two pictures, right?

Any objection to leaving them in the record from the Applicant?

MR. NEEDLEMAN: I'm not sure it matters that much. I will say we submitted the Committee's requested photos of the Bay from Newington which does a better job at this point of portraying this, and I'm not even sure it was used. So I guess we don't need to argue about it at this late hour. I just don't see the need to keep it in.

MR. ASLIN: I do recall it being used if that's of any relevance. I recall Attorney Richardson using it during cross-examination to point out the location of potential concrete mattresses on the Newington side.

PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: I recall that as well, with the cables coming up, and I do recall looking at this photo in connection with the testimony.

I think we will not strike this one from

the record. We'll leave it in. The Committee may find it helpful.

MR. IACOPINO: So what we'll do with the exhibit list now is we'll put all the other ones in, they'll have the word "struck" next to them, and this one will be a full exhibit based on the Presiding Officer's ruling.

Okay. I have questions for the Applicant about responses to record requests. Mr.

Needleman, you answered one of my questions.

We're expecting a photosimulation. This was requested by Mr. Way on Day 9. The other side of the bay from the photosimulation that we have. We have a photosim for, I believe, the Durham side but not for the Newington side. Do I have that backwards?

MR. NEEDLEMAN: Applicant's 269. I think it was filed.

MR. IACOPINO: Okay. On Day 6 there was a request for any notes or further information.

I'm just going to throw this out there. I don't think it's probably relevant at this point because Crowley Joyce has withdrawn, but notes or further information why notice was not

1 required under Wetlands Rule 304.04. 2 MR. NEEDLEMAN: Yes. We didn't pursue that 3 because we settled. PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: And you 4 5 filed the Autotransformer route. Do you 6 remember which number that was given? MR. NEEDLEMAN: Wasn't it given a Committee 7 number? 8 9 MR. IACOPINO: May have been. We have three numbers for that one. That's my list. 10 11 MR. ASLIN: Did the Applicant indicate any 12 objections? I missed that part. 13 MR. IACOPINO: Haven't got there. Do you 14 have any objections? 15 MR. NEEDLEMAN: No. We're all set. 16 PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Okay. 17 will close the record. Record is now closed. 18 ADMINISTRATOR MONROE: I did mention to a 19 few of you, but the court reporters have agreed 20 to expedite the transcripts. They'll be coming 21 in as they're completed, but they're going to 22 work their little fingers to the bone, and 23 they're going to do their damndest to get them 24 in here by Friday, November 2nd.

1 MS. GEIGER: I'm just clarifying when the 2 briefs are due. PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Parties and 3 CFP 14 days from today and 21 days for the 4 5 Applicant. Let's double-check. 6 ADMINISTRATOR MONROE: Revised Procedural Order was issued on May 31st, 2018, and it 7 states that Counsel for the Public and 8 9 Intervenors shall file briefs within 14 days of 10 the close of the record, and then the Applicant 11 shall file its brief within 21 days of closing 12 the record. MR. ASLIN: Given that it is a Friday at 13 14 whatever time it is, normally 14 days would 15 count beginning tomorrow, would end on a 16 Saturday. Are we in agreement that under the 17 rules that that would kick us to Monday for the 18 filing of those? Whatever Monday that is. 19 Typically that would do that MR. IACOPINO: if it lands on a Saturday. 20 21 MR. ASLIN: I just want everyone to be 22 clear on what the date is so we're not confused. 23 MR. HERBERT: Monday is October 11. 24 Actually November 11th.

1	MR. ASLIN: That Monday, it turns out, is
2	Veterans Day.
3	MR. IACOPINO: The Applicant falls on a
4	Saturday as well.
5	PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: The 12th is
6	Veterans Day, and that's the holiday. And the
7	Applicant has 19th. Give them 7 days. So
8	Intervenors and Counsel for the Public on the
9	13th of November, Applicant on the 20th. And
10	then we have deliberations the week of the 25th.
11	PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Just so
12	Cindy has that, so the Counsel for the Public
13	and Intervenor briefs will be due November 13th
14	and the Applicant's brief will be due November
15	20th.
16	MR. PATCH: No page limits.
17	MR. IACOPINO: Please be reasonable.
18	Anything over ten pages, we want a table of
19	contents. Okay.
20	PRESIDING OFFICER WEATHERSBY: Anything
21	else? Okay. We are adjourned.
22	MR. NEEDLEMAN: Thank you.
23	MR. PATCH: Thank you.
24	(Hearing ended at 7:10 p.m.)
