

NEW HAMPSHIRE Water main break in capital

CONCORD (AP) — Crews have stopped the flow of water down Main Street in Concord following a water main break near New Hampshire's Statehouse, where construction crews have been working on renovations. The street had been partially closed off Tuesday morning as construction workers continued digging for the Concord Main Street Project. The water stopped flowing shortly before 10 a.m.

Water was shut off at Main Street businesses. Other areas of the city could see low or no water pressure, and discoloration in the water.

A groundbreaking ceremony to mark the Concord Main Street Project is scheduled for Monday, April 20.

Unemployment stable for March

CONCORD (AP) — The New Hampshire Employment Security Office says the state's unemployment rate for March was 3.9 percent, unchanged from the February rate.

In March 2014, the seasonally adjusted rate for New Hampshire was 4.5 percent.

Nationally, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for March was 3.9 percent, unchanged from the February rate, and a decrease of 1.1 percentage points from the March 2014 rate.

In New Hampshire, seasonally adjusted estimates for March placed the number of employed residents at 716,940, an increase of 2,230 from the previous month and an increase of 8,300 from March 2014.

The number of unemployed residents decreased by 350 over the month to 26,940. This was 4,630 fewer unemployed than in March 2014.

VERMONT

4th most in AmeriCorps

MONTPELIER (AP) — The federal agency that administers the AmeriCorps program says Vermont ranks fourth in the country in the per-capita enrollment of AmeriCorps members.

Since AmeriCorps was formed 20 years ago, Vermont has produced more than 4,700 AmeriCorps members who have given more than 6.9 million hours of service to their country and received more than \$15 million in scholarships.

The Corporation for National and Community Service, which administers the AmeriCorps program, is funding more than 300 AmeriCorps positions throughout Vermont.

In the rankings released Tuesday, Vermont ranked fourth, behind Montana, the District of Columbia and Minnesota.

Student faces sexting charges

GUILFORD (AP) — An 18-year-old student at Piscataquis Community High School has been charged with receiving and sharing child pornography after allegedly sexting with a 13-year-old girl.

District Attorney Christopher Almy says Keenan Larry of Abbot faces at least five years in prison if convicted of felony charges, including sexual exploitation of a minor.

A police affidavit indicates Larry allegedly pressured the 13-year-old to make the video.

Dartmouth fraternity is 'derecognized' for branding

HANOVER (AP) — A Dartmouth College fraternity that partly inspired the 1978 movie "Animal House" has been "derecognized" by a campus judicial committee after reports that some new members received brands on their skin.

The committee found Alpha Delta responsible for causing harm to members and violating terms of a suspension for alcohol violations. Its determination comes as several fraternities around the country are being criticized for bad behavior.

The fraternity has until Monday to appeal. Fraternity President Ryan Maguire on Tuesday told The Valley News that no decision on whether to appeal has been made yet.

"Alpha Delta is aware of the college's decision to withdraw recognition of the fraternity," Maguire wrote in an email. "We are disappointed by this decision and are exploring the options available to us, including the appeal process."

Regardless of the outcome of an appeal, the college's interim dean, Inge-Lise

Ameer has the authority to withdraw recognition of Alpha Delta. She's taken evidence from the committee under advisement.

Alpha Delta, whose current Dartmouth President Philip Hanlon was once a brother, has a significant record of disciplinary violations, including hazing, serving alcohol to minors and hosting unregistered parties. The recent allegations involve incidents that happened last fall, when the fraternity was under suspension for previous policy violations.

Attorney George Oster said last month that the fraternity acknowledged a small number of members voluntarily chose to get body brands. He said the practice was never a condition of membership and has since stopped. Oster did not return a call from The Associated Press on Tuesday.

Over the past few months, fraternities on other campuses have been investigated and some have shut down.

Still no verdict on Day 6 of deliberations in ex-Pat case

FALL RIVER, Mass. — After six days of deliberating, jurors went home Tuesday without reaching a verdict in the murder trial of former New England Patriots player Aaron Hernandez, who is accused of killing the man dating his fiancée's sister.

Hernandez has pleaded not guilty in the killing of Odin Lloyd in June 2013. Testimony in the case lasted for more than two months, and deliberations have stretched on for nearly 25 hours.

Superior Court Judge Susan Garsh sent jurors home late Tuesday afternoon with reminders to avoid all news on the TV, radio, newspaper or other media and to not to discuss the case with anyone.

The 12 jurors must reach a unanimous verdict. In addition to the murder charge, the jurors are also deciding whether to convict Hernandez of weapon and ammunition possession charges.

Shayanna Jenkins, Hernandez's fiancée, sat in the front row behind him, and they exchanged glances during the few minutes he was in court. Across the aisle, her sister, Shanelle, sat with Lloyd's mother and other family members.

Prosecutors never offered a clear motive for why Hernandez would want to kill Lloyd.

The defense has acknowledged that Hernandez witnessed the killing but questioned why he would put his career on the line to kill someone.

If convicted of first-degree murder, Hernandez would be sentenced to life in prison without parole.

Day will mark two years since Boston Marathon bombing

BOSTON — Boston will mark the second anniversary of the 2013 marathon bombings Wednesday with a subdued remembrance that includes a moment of silence, the pealing of church bells and a call for kindness.

Mayor Marty Walsh and other officials will raise commemorative banners on Boylston Street early Wednesday. A moment of silence follows at 2:49 p.m., marking the time the first of two bombs exploded near the finish line April 15, 2013. Church bells will then ring throughout the city.

Mayor Walsh has also declared April 15 "One Boston Day," a new tradition meant to honor the city's resilience and spread goodwill.

The relatively modest remembrance comes in contrast to 2014's commemoration of the attacks, which killed three people and injured more than 260 others.

CONCORD (AP) — Crews have stopped the flow of water down Main Street in Concord following a water main break near New Hampshire's Statehouse, where construction crews have been working on renovations.

The street had been partially closed off Tuesday morning as construction workers continued digging for the Concord Main Street Project. The water stopped flowing shortly before 10 a.m.

Water was shut off at Main Street businesses.

Other areas of the city could see low or no water pressure, and discolored water in the water.

A groundbreaking ceremony to mark the Concord Main Street Project is scheduled for Monday, April 20.

Unemployment stable for March

CONCORD (AP) — The New Hampshire Employment Security office says the state's unemployment rate for March was 3.9 percent, unchanged from the February rate.

In March 2014, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for March was 3.9 percent, unchanged from the February rate, and a decrease of 1.1 percentage points from the March 2014 rate.

In New Hampshire, seasonally adjusted estimates for March placed the number of employed residents at 716,940, an increase of 2,230 from the previous month and an increase of 9,290 from March 2014.

The number of unemployed residents decreased by 330 over the month to 28,940. This was 4,630 fewer unemployed than in March 2014.

VERMONT

4th most in AmeriCorps

MONTPELIER (AP) — The federal agency that administers the AmeriCorps program says Vermont ranks fourth in the country in the per-capita enrollment of AmeriCorps members.

Since AmeriCorps was formed 20 years ago, Vermont has produced more than 4,700 AmeriCorps members who have given more than 6.9 million hours of service to their country and received more than \$15 million in scholarships.

The Corporation for National and Community Service, which administers the AmeriCorps program, is funding more than 300 AmeriCorps positions throughout Vermont.

In the rankings released Tuesday, Vermont ranked fourth, behind Montana, the District of Columbia and Minnesota.

Student faces sexting charges

GUILFORD (AP) — An 18-year-old student at Piscataquis Community High School has been charged with receiving and sharing child pornography after allegedly sexting with a 13-year-old girl.

District Attorney Christopher Almy says Keenan Larry of Alton faces at least five years in prison if convicted of felony charges, including sexual exploitation of a minor.

A police affidavit indicates Larry allegedly pressured the 13-year-old to make the video.

Larry was suspended from school and was arrested Monday. He's due for an initial court appearance on May 4.

Dartmouth fraternity is 'derecognized' for branding

HANOVER (AP) — A Dartmouth College fraternity that partly inspired the 1978 movie "Animal House" has been "derecognized" by a campus judicial committee after reports that some new members received brands on their skin.

The committee found Alpha Delta responsible for causing harm to members and violating terms of a suspension for alcohol violations. Its determination comes as several fraternities around the country are being criticized for bad behavior.

The fraternity was until Monday to appeal. Fraternity President Ryan Maguire on Tuesday told The Valley News that no decision on whether to appeal has been made yet.

"Alpha Delta is aware of the college's decision to withdraw recognition of the fraternity," Maguire wrote in an email. "We are disappointed by this decision and are exploring the options available to us, including the appeal process."

Regardless of the outcome of an appeal, the college's interim dean, Inge-Lise

Ameer, has the authority to withdraw recognition of Alpha Delta. She's taken evidence from the committee under advisement.

Alpha Delta, where current Dartmouth President Philip Hanlon was once a brother, has a significant record of disciplinary violations, including hazing, serving alcohol to minors and hosting unregistered parties. The recent allegations involve incidents that happened last fall, when the fraternity was under suspension for previous policy violations.

Attorney George Ostler said last month that the fraternity acknowledged a small number of members voluntarily chose to get body brands. He said the practice was never a condition of membership and has since stopped. Ostler did not return a call from The Associated Press on Tuesday.

Over the past few months, fraternities on other campuses have been investigated and some have shut down.

FALL RIVER, Mass. — After six days of deliberating, jurors went home Tuesday without reaching a verdict in the murder trial of former New England Patriots player Aaron Hernandez, who is accused of killing the man dating his fiancée's sister.

Hernandez has pleaded not guilty in the killing of Odin Lloyd in June 2013. Testimony in the case lasted for more than two months, and deliberations have stretched on for nearly 35 hours.

Superior Court Judge Susan Garsh sent jurors home late Tuesday afternoon with reminders to avoid all news on the TV, radio, newspaper or other media and to not to discuss the case with anyone.

The 12 jurors must reach a unanimous verdict. In addition to the murder charge, the jurors are also deciding whether to convict Hernandez of weapon and ammunition possession charges.

Shayanna Jenkins, Hernandez's fiancée, sat in the front row behind him, and they exchanged glances during the four minutes he was in court. Across the aisle, her sister, Shaneah, sat with Lloyd's mother and other family members.

Prosecutors never offered a clear motive for why Hernandez would want to kill Lloyd.

The defense has acknowledged that Hernandez witnessed the killing but questioned why he would put his career on the line to kill someone.

If convicted of first-degree murder, Hernandez would be sentenced to life in prison without parole.

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Day will mark two years since Boston Marathon bombing

BOSTON — Boston will mark the second anniversary of the 2013 marathon bombings Wednesday with a subdued remembrance that includes a moment of silence, the pealing of church bells and a call for kindness.

Mayor Marty Walsh and other officials will raise commemorative banners on Boylston Street early Wednesday. A moment of silence follows at 2:49 p.m., marking the time the first of two bombs exploded near the finish line April 15, 2013. Church bells will then ring throughout the city.

Mayor Walsh has also declared April 15 "One Boston Day," a new tradition meant to honor the city's resilience and spread goodwill.

The relatively modest remembrance comes in contrast to 2014's commemoration of the attacks, which killed three people and injured more than 260 others.
