Dear Landowner:

You are receiving this letter because you are a landowner along the proposed Northern Pass route, and we want to keep you updated on the latest developments with the Project.

Over the last several months Northern Pass has achieved several milestones, including: announcing our new Project route and Forward NH Plan in August; submitting our application to the New Hampshire Site Evaluation Committee (SEC) in October; and receiving the order of completeness issued by the SEC in December.

In September 2015, we held a series of Public Information Sessions, as required by the SEC, in each county along the proposed route. After the Project received the order of completeness from the SEC, we held a second series of Public Information Sessions in January 2016. The next round of required SEC Public Information Sessions has now been scheduled for March 2016, and is listed below:

Rockingham County:


