ORDER AND NOTICE OF
PRE-HEARING CONFERENCE AND
PUBLIC HEARING
Background

On October 28, 2015, Granite Ridge Energy, LLC (Granite Ridge), and Calpine Granite Holdings, LLC (Calpine), filed a Joint Petition with the Site Evaluation Committee (Committee) seeking approval to transfer membership interests in Granite Ridge to Calpine. The Joint Petition requested the appointment of a three-member subcommittee under RSA 162-H and an expedited review and approval of the proposed transfer of ownership interests in Granite Ridge to Calpine. On November 13, 2015, an order was issued appointing a subcommittee.

Granite Ridge owns and operates a 720-megawatt combined cycle natural gas-fired power plant in Londonderry, New Hampshire (Facility), and currently holds the Certificate of Site and Facility that was granted in May 1999 to AES Londonderry, LLC (SEC Docket No. 98-02). In 2004, the Committee approved transfer of the Facility ownership to lenders through voluntary foreclosure and appointment of a special purpose holding company, which was an entity of convenience to own and operate the Facility through a contractor while a purchaser for the Facility was sought (SEC Docket No. 2004-01).

The Facility company name was subsequently changed to Granite Ridge and a new holding company, Granite Ridge Holdings, LLC, was formed to hold the membership interests in Granite Ridge. The Joint Petition requests the Committee to approve the transfer of the membership interest to Calpine.

The Committee's authority to approve or deny the proposed transfer of membership interests is set forth at RSA 162-H:4 and RSA 162-H:5, I.

Any person wishing to intervene in this matter shall file a motion to intervene on or before **December 21, 2015**. Motions to intervene shall comply with the requirements of RSA 541-A:32 and N.H. CODE OF ADMINISTRATIVE RULES, Site 202.11. Objections to motions to intervene shall be filed by **December 31, 2015**.

Unidentified package causes bomb scare

NORTH HAMPTON — The New Hampshire State Police Bomb Squad was called to a false alarm in town Friday, causing traffic to be delayed briefly on North Road.

A North Road resident called North Hampton police at 2:30 p.m. to report an unidentified package delivered to their home, according to a press release from North Hampton police and fire. The package was described as a cylindrical snow globe with a chip and wires inside it. It was mailed from China with no return address and had the reporting party's maiden name on the package.

The bomb squad was called after North

Hampton fire arrived at the scene. North Road was closed off from Lafayette Road, and North Hampton School was notified bus routes would be interrupted.

Officials learned the call was a false alarm when the caller's husband told them he had ordered a baby bath time light to be delivered to the home, according to the press release. The husband sent a text message confirming this was the case, which was shown to authorities. The scene was cleared and roads were opened again at 3:13 p.m., and the bomb squad call was canceled before the squad arrived at the scene.

New Hampshire State Police, New Hampshire Fish & Game, Greenland police and Rye police also responded to the scene.
