

Notice of Public Information Session

Pursuant to RSA 162-H:10, New Hampshire Transmission, LLC will hold an Open House and Public Information Session on December 1, 2021 beginning at 5:30 p.m. at the Seabrook Public Library, 25 Liberty Lane, Seabrook, New Hampshire to present information regarding a proposed capacitor bank and circuit breaker project (“the Facility”) to be located in the Town of Seabrook and for which New Hampshire Transmission, LLC intends to submit an Application for a Certificate of Site and Facility, pursuant to RSA 162-H:7, to the New Hampshire Site Evaluation Committee (SEC), including a request for an exemption pursuant to RSA 162-H:4 or a determination that this project is not a “sizeable addition” pursuant to RSA 162-H:5. The Open House will begin at 5:00 p.m. where project representatives will provide information concerning the project and answer questions. The Public Information Session will immediately follow at 5:30 p.m. and members of the public will be given an opportunity to present comments and ask questions. The Public Information Session will be transcribed. A copy of the transcript will be included with the application to the SEC. Nature and Location of the Proposed Facility

New Hampshire Transmission, LLC is developing two 50 MVAR capacitor banks, three 345 kV circuit breakers and a short transmission line tap adjacent to the electric transmission substation at the Seabrook Station power plant. This proposed Facility will be located on property that currently serves as a parking lot for Seabrook Station, which is located north of the north access road to the power station (north of Rocks Road), east of Lafayette Road US Route 1. The Facility is needed to ensure the safety and reliability of the high voltage electric transmission grid and was selected as a project to address a reliability issue identified by the independent, non-profit regional electric transmission organization in New England, ISO-NE.

UNH miscues costly in loss to URI

SOUTH KINGSTOWN, R.I. — Where to start when analyzing the University of Rhode Island's 28-3 victory over UNH in Saturday's CAA game?

One could start with the penalties assessed to the Wildcats, who lost their seventh consecutive game. UNH, which came in averaging five penalties per game, was penalized 11 times for 92 yards — which didn't sit well with coach Sean McDonnell.

"We are not concentrating on the simple, little things before the snap even happens," said McDonnell, whose club dropped to 3-7 overall, 2-5 in the CAA. "We're getting a bunch of procedure penalties."

"There were a couple of penalties on the defensive side of the ball ... the late hits, the targeting stuff. It's undisciplined and it's disappointing. It's hard to see when you put that stuff on tape."

Coming into this game,

UNH had been averaging 17.7 points and 285 yards of total offense. Saturday, the Wildcats managed 159 yards.

"I thought their defense did some good things playing downhill," McDonnell said. "We didn't execute our run game very effectively (24 yards on 25 carries)."

"We went to the passing game and (quarterback) Bret (Edwards) was running for his life a little bit. Their defense is consistently doing the job and the little things well."

URI (7-3, 4-3) needed 49 seconds after the opening kickoff to grab a 7-0 lead.

Quarterback Kasim Hill (12-for-23, 221 yards) threw a short pass in the left flat to Jaylen Smith and he broke it for an 81-yard touchdown run.

After an exchange of punts, UNH drove to the Rams 4 only to settle for a 20-yard field goal by Sean Leahane.

URI maintained that 7-3 lead until the second quarter when Hill again engineered a scoring drive. The

Rams, who are seeking a postseason berth, covered 55 yards in 11 plays (which took seven minutes off the clock) with Hill tossing a 6-yard touchdown pass to Matt Pires.

URI had an opportunity to increase its lead only to have C.J. Carrick miss a 24-yard field goal.

First-half stats revealed how the game played with URI outrunning UNH, 233-59, in total yardage.

The Rams made it 21-3 early in the third quarter on a penalty-aided drive. Before Hill snapped a 1-yard touchdown pass to Smith, UNH was penalized for roughing the passer and pass interference.

UNH followed with another promising drive as the Wildcats reached the Rams 10. But on fourth-and-sixth, Tommy Herion's pass was incomplete. Herion was inserted into the game after Edwards suffered a head injury in the third quarter.

After Coby Tippet intercepted the fourth quarter, Hill threw his fourth touchdown

pass of the game, a 20-yarder to Ivory Fimpong.

The Wildcats finish their season next Saturday at home against rival Maine.

Other games

Dartmouth 41, Cornell 7: Nick Howard made sure the Dartmouth football team stayed on the path to the Ivy League title. Howard, a junior quarterback, rushed for 172 yards and four touchdowns as the Big Green drubbed Cornell at Memorial Field in Hanover.

The victory enabled Dartmouth (9-1 overall) to improve to 6-1 in the Ivies. The Big Green are tied with Princeton for first place with one weekend left.

UMass-Dartmouth 28, Plymouth State 7: In Dartmouth, Mass., Manny Sanchez rushed for 142 yards and a TD in the Panthers' loss. PSU finished 5-5 overall, 5-3 in the MASCAC.

New Haven 34, Franklin Pierce 20: In Rindge, the Ravens finished 0-10 and 0-8 in the Northeast-10 despite two rushing TDs by E.J. Burgess.

Coe-Brown's Cox paces NH runners at NE XC

Three New Hampshire runners finished in the top 10 of the boys New England Cross Country Championships in Theford, Va., on Saturday.

Coe-Brown junior Aidan Cox was the top Granite Stater, finishing in 16 minutes, 41.97 seconds, just edging Lebanon's Brianu Harriman, who

ran at a 16:45:55 pace. Gilford's Patrick Gandini was 10th in 16:49:30, Concord's (West Hartford, Conn.) Gavin Sherry won the race with a time of 15:54:79.

U-32 of Vermont won the team title, while Coe-Brown, Bishop Guertin and Concord, came in sixth, eighth

and ninth, respectively.

On the girls' side, Souhegan senior Chloe Trueld was the top NH finisher at 19:54:6. Ruth White of Orono, Maine, won with a time of 18:44:8. Dover was eighth in the team standings, led by Brooke Marshall's 18th-place finish in 20:13:86.

six penalties called, five against the offense.

There were two false starts and one holding call along with Jones having two delay-of-game penalties.

It wasn't much better the previous two games, with the Pats flagged for 10 penalties for 125 yards.

And if not penalties, turnovers keep cropping in. The Patriots put the ball on the ground three times against the Panthers, losing just one. Jones also threw an interception.

Against the Bengals last week, the Browns produced three turnovers (two picks, one fumble recovery). So cleaning up their act is another key.

UNH men's basketball team throws scare into Marquette

If you predicted that the UNH basketball team would have a chance in the final seconds to send Friday's road game against Marquette into overtime, take a bow.

Because that's what happened. With the Wildcats down three points, Blonda Tchoukouegno took the ball downcourt and drove to the basket. He absorbed contact but missed a short shot with five seconds left. Marquette's Justin Lewis grabbed the rebound, was fouled, and made two free throws to seal away a 75-70 victory for the Big East's Golden Eagles before 12,000 fans at Fiserv Forum in Milwaukee.

Seeking one of their biggest upsets in recent years in their first road game of the season, the Wildcats gave Marquette all it could handle. UNH led for most of the first half, and after getting down by nine early in the second half, rallied again and briefly led before a 3-point field goal by Darryl Morsell with 4:14 remaining restored Marquette's lead (64-62).

Morsell led all scorers with 26 points. Senior forward Jayden Martinez was immense for the Wildcats with 21 points and eight rebounds, and Nick Guadarrama added 15 points, including three straight 3-pointers early in the second half, and eight rebounds.

Next up for the Wildcats is another Big East foe, Providence College, on Thursday night at the Dunkin' Donuts Center.

Celtics' Smart delivers timely breakout in win

BOSTON — Entering Friday's game against the Milwaukee Bucks, there was one player in the NBA who attempted more than eight field goals per game and was shooting worse than Marcus Smart over his first 10 games of the season: Orlando Magic rookie Jalen Suggs (30.6%).

Scoring has never been Smart's strong suit but he opened the 2021-22 season as some historically bad levels even by his standards. The point guard was shooting 32.6% from the field and 28.1% from 3-point range (16th-worst in NBA among qualifiers) while attempting 5.7 per game.

A number of Boston's starters have gotten off to brutal shooting starts but Smart was as responsible as anyone for the team's lackluster 22nd offensive rating during a 5-6 start when combining his poor shooting and higher-than-usual turnover rate in his new starting role.

With Jaylen Brown sidelined with a hamstring injury for the past week, the onus has shifted offensively for Boston over the past few games. Teams are able to key on Jayson Tatum more without worrying about Boston's secondary options making them pay. That has led teams to bet even more against Boston's guards, such as Smart, hitting the open looks — which they are happy to concede to ensure that Tatum can't beat them all by himself.

On Friday night against the Bucks, Smart made Milwaukee pay for this strategy on a night Boston desperately needed a scoring boost. While Dennis Schröder erupted for 38 points in the overtime win, Smart's efficient season-high 19 points and a team-high six assists were both pivotal in helping ensure the 122-113 victory for Boston against an undermanned Milwaukee squad.

Smart himself was responsible for breathing life into the hosts in the third quarter by scoring 12 straight points for Boston in one four-minute stretch, snapping them out of a first-half lull.
