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11	DISCUSSION OF THE MOTION:
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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	CHAIRMAN BURACK: Good morning. We are
3	going to resume the meeting of the State of New Hampshire
4	Site Evaluation Committee here on December 1st. And, I
5	want to take things again a little bit out of order,
6	because we do have Attorney Patch here already, would like
7	to move very quickly to our old business and consider
8	docket number 2008-04, motion of Granite Ridge Energy, LLC
9	for a declaratory ruling regarding the addition of a cold
10	storage building at the Granite Ridge facility in
11	Londonderry, New Hampshire.
12	I'm going to ask, in just a moment, ask
13	Attorney Patch to provide us with a brief update from
14	Granite Ridge Energy, LLC. But, before doing that, I will

18 CHAIRMAN BURACK: Thank you. And, to my

19 immediate right is Attorney Michael Lacopino, who serves

- 22 MR. PATCH: Thank you, Mr. Chairman,
- 23 members of the Committee. My name is Doug Patch. I'm
- 24 appearing here on behalf of Granite Ridge Energy. And, I

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- 1 was asked to give a brief update of where things stand in
- 2 terms of that storage facility that in our letter of July
- 3 8th of this year we had requested that the Committee make
- 4 a determination that this particular storage facility
- 5 would not constitute a sizeable addition. And, so, --
- 6 And, then, there was a hearing that the Committee had back
- 7 in July where you had treated that like a Motion for
- 8 Declaratory Ruling, and had asked that we work with the
- 9 town and get back to you, and I apologize that we have not
- submitted anything to you as of this point in time.
- To give you a brief update, we met with
- 12 the Town Manager in September. And, after that, we have
- 13 had some e-mail correspondence with the attorney for the
- 14 Town, Mr. Upton. And, we are now at the point where we're
- trying to set up a conference call between the architect
- for this addition and some of the staff people for the
- town, just to clarify what building code requirements
- would apply to the new addition.
- 19 And, again, I apologize this hasn't
- 20 moved faster, but it's just taken longer than we
- 21 anticipated. As soon as we have done that, we would
- 22 intend to get back to the Committee. And, obviously, it's
- our delay with this that has caused the Committee to go
- 24 beyond the 90 days that it requires in the rules for the

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1	issuance of a motion for declaratory ruling. So, clearly,
2	the ball's in our court on that, and we appreciate the
3	Committee's indulgence on this.
4	I'd be happy to answer any questions you
5	might have about that. But I think that's pretty much an
6	overview of where we are.
7	CHAIRMAN BURACK: Thank you. Are there
8	questions for Attorney Patch? Commissioner Getz.
9	VICE CHAIRMAN GETZ: Well, I just had a
10	procedural schedule for counsel about the 90 days. I
11	mean, I think, at the hearing in July, we said that the 90
12	days started of that hearing, if I recall correctly. I
13	mean, I don't know if we need a specific waiver from the
14	Petitioner, or if we just take the position that the 90
15	days are tolled because we were expecting a response from
16	them that we have yet to receive. And, you know, maybe
17	one way of looking at this is the 90 days doesn't begin to
18	run until they have essentially completed their petition.
19	So, it's just that procedural observation.
20	MR. IACOPINO: I would suggest that the
21	Committee entertain a motion, a waiver of the 90 days on
22	the basis that we have insufficient information from the
23	Commissioner from the Company to permit us to consider
24	the request in more detail. This particular item sort of
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1	fell between when we didn't have rules and when we did
2	have rules. And, that's why it's sort of in this posture,

as far as what we're calling it. But, nonetheless, I Page $\boldsymbol{6}$

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4	would suggest that the Committee entertain such a motion,
5	just to keep the record clean.
6	Also, I think that Mr. Patch has
7	admitted that the failure is on the part of the Company to
8	provide us the information that they indicated they were
9	going to provide at that hearing in July. And, it sounds
10	as though they're working towards getting it, but it's
11	just been slow going on the ground, so to speak.
12	CMSR. BALD: So moved.
13	CHAIRMAN BURACK: There's a motion. Is
14	there a second to the motion?
15	CMSR. MORRISON: Second.
16	CHAIRMAN BURACK: Second by
17	Mr. Morrison. Okay. Discussion of the motion?
18	DIR. IGNATIUS: I have a question.
19	CHAIRMAN BURACK: Director Ignatius.
20	DIR. IGNATIUS: Is the 90 day
21	requirement only found in the rules, and not in the
22	statute?
23	MR. IACOPINO: Yes. There is no
24	reference to declaratory ruling process whatsoever in the
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1	statute. There's certainly lots of areas for us to decide
2	we have to make some kind of rulings, but there is none.
3	And, I believe it is Rule 202.15 that permits a waiver
4	when it serves the public interest and will not disrupt
5	the orderly and efficient resolution of matters before the
6	Committee. And, that's Rule 202.15 in our rules, gives us
7	authority to waive any portion of the rules.
