I too am very disappointed and concur with the sentiments of Mr. Urso and the Millsfield residents. I am an Intervenor for the proposed wind facility and have felt that everything is being done to accommodate the Applicant. The Millsfield people have tried to be cooperative and have just been shammed through this whole process. The reasons given that the Committee has full time jobs is just a smoke screen to keep Coos residents from being involved.

The application process has had nothing but political ramifications and has only deepened as time has gone on. Nothing is being done in terms of justice for the Coos residents.

I will be forwarding a letter to Mr. Michael Iacopino to let him know there will be days of the hearing process that I will not be able to attend. I suppose this is exactly the way everyone involved wants it. Mr. Iacopino and the Committee can't decide if 9:00 AM or 10:00 AM is when the hearings should begin. They think about themselves, not the people that must travel 2+ hours one way from Coos County. The ones that have a vested interest.

You are about to change our lives up here for the worse and still you throw politics in our face. The Committee has only visited the site briefly, in the rain, and has not been there since.

It all starts with the proposed guidelines that Amy Ignatius was a member of the Commission that decided it was not necessary to have them and her husband involved as an Intervenor and an Attorney to the Senate to get the ball rolling for upgrading the Coos County Electrical Grid so they can swoop in and make millions. And then there is Doug Patch, applicant's attorney, that was a member of the SEC and employed by the PUC---became a lobbyist and was instrumental in lobbying for bills that would make an easy path for this project and others. I have only scratched the surface here. There is plenty more that has been given to my Attorney to compile a letter to the New Hampshire Attorney General's office for an investigation. And not to mention the back door deals with the AMC and F & G and an attorney from the AG's office.....and it goes on.
