Subject: Turbine Wind Syndrome

Dear Commissioner Burack, Today's NH Union Leader references concern over "adverse effect on rural residents and vacationers" regarding the industrial installation of 24 wind turbines in the Groton, Plymouth, Rumney areas with application for review by the NH Site Evaluation Committee just filed last week. The article references "over 200 homes in the Baker River Valley, mostly in Rumney and Plymouth" which could therefore represent future victims of what is now an issue of concern to both the Vermont and New York State Legislatures: Turbine Wind Syndrome. As I read the proponents of this concern it exposes inhabitants living within a few miles of the turbines to intense inner-ear symptoms including nausea, vomiting, dizziness, headaches, malaise, disturbed sleeping, panic and other secondary sequelae. Industrial opponents of this concept minimize the health hazards and the poor citizenry are left worrying about the possibility of cavalier, criminal negligence on the part of those parties making money on such a project but giving no consideration to subsequent injury sustained by residents of the Baker River Valley.
