As per NH RSA 541-A:32, I am following the criteria stipulated to be granted intervenor status for the Groton Wind Farm SEC Docket No. 2010-01, as I believe my rights, duties, privileges, immunities and other substantial interests will be significantly affected by this project. In addition, I believe that no one else will adequately protect my interests as I can in this process.

My property which includes my business and home, abuts the Baker River as well as Quincy Road. As the owner of a campground, my business will be significantly impacted by the potential destruction of the environment, both during the construction phase as well as once the Groton Wind Farm is operational. The Baker River is a huge tourism draw, due to its pristine nature, offering great fishing, swimming, kayaking and tubing. Any harm done to this beautiful river or to the significant aesthetic quality of the area could have an untenable detrimental impact to the entire tourism industry in the Baker Valley, including my business.

Noise pollution and adverse health effects t are continuing to be documented from wind turbines improperly sited. I do not believe that Iberdrola has conducted adequate noise studies for this project. For this reason, I am concerned that my business will be harmed by noise heard from the turbines. A large number of my customers are tenters, who may not return if they are not able to sleep with continuous turbine noise.

By allowing my intervention, I will not in any way impair the interests of justice and the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings.
