Dear SEC,

We herewith express our belief and concern that the construction of 24 industrial wind turbines on the ridgelines of Fletcher and Tenney Mountains, overlooking the Baker River Valley, will prove an economic disaster for the region.

From the data that we gathered we learned that a windfarm in close proximity to residential neighborhoods can turn an eden into hell.

This project will be visible for miles in the surrounding area but from our living room and our bedroom windows

it will stare us right in the face, without lifting our heads off the pillow.

From our backyard we have full view of the Fletcher ridge and considering that our house, 774 Quincy Road,

cannot be more than 1 1/2 miles distance from the proposed wind turbine sites and considering that sound in

the Baker River Valley reverberates and echos between the mountain slopes, we feel justified in our worry that this project will render the impacted area unliveable.

We therefore agree with and support all the testimonies, arguments, reservations and statements made by ourselves and our fellow intervenors, opposing this project, and fully agree with the testimonies of the experts called upon to testify on our behalf. o.a. Mc. Cann, Tocci, Nissenbaum etc.

The question remains, which party will be responsible for the financial restitution of possible loss and damages

suffered by homeowners forced to live too close to this wind turbine installation?

How does a project that promises jobs and money to some parties and threatens the lifetime savings and the wellbeing of a whole bunch of others, assure the orderly development of a region ?

Obviously, some serious regulation is necessary to avoid a lot of human suffering in the wake of the wind turbine invasion.
