On behalf of the Gregg Lake Association (GLA) of Antrim New Hampshire, I am contacting you in the matter of Docket No. 2012-01, Application of Antrim Wind, LLC for a Certificate of Site and Facility for a Renewable Energy Facility to be Located in Antrim, Hillsborough Country, New Hampshire.

As per documents cited on <http://www.nhsec.nh.gov/2012-01/index.htm>, the GLA is petitioning to become an intervenor in the proceedings related to the proposed Antrim Wind Farm project. At the annual meeting of the GLA on June 16, 2012, members voted affirmative (with two abstentions, and no nay votes) to seek intervenor status as a group. As vice president of the GLA, I am submitting the paperwork for the group (see attached).

The Gregg Lake Association realizes that it is filing a late motion to intervene. However, members feel that although we are mostly seasonal homeowners, we are also major stakeholders regarding the scope, siting, visual and sound impacts of the project, all of which will affect us quite directly.

GLA members articulated several concerns regarding the Antrim Wind Energy project. Foremost is the effect of the sound of the turbines during various weather and wind conditions, and how that sound will be heard across the lake at various locations and times, and how it might impact families both outdoors and within their homes. GLA members also expressed concerns related but not limited to: prevention of invasive plant species during construction of roads to the turbines;


changes in water quality from road construction run-off and the impact on wildlife as well as watersheds that empty into Gregg Lake, Willard Pond and North Branch stream; and protection of inland Atlantic white cedar wetlands adjacent to the project area during and after road construction. These issues are of critical concern, even to seasonal homeowners, and might not be addressed by those who do not own property directly on or near the lake.


(3) The intervention of the Gregg Lake Association will be in the interest of justice and will not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings by allowing the intervention.




