MOTION TO INTERVENE PRO SE OF THE GREGG LAKE ASSOCIATION

Pursuant to the New Hampshire Site Evaluation Committee Rules Site 2012.11, the Gregg Lake Association hereby moves for permission to intervene *pro se* in the above-referenced proceeding. In support of its Motion to Intervene, the Gregg Lake Association offers the following arguments:

(1) The Gregg Lake Association can demonstrate a substantial interest which may be affected by the outcome of the proceeding.

The Gregg Lake Association (GLA) has been in existence since the 1960's. Article III of its by-laws state that it was established for the "conservation and protection of the lake, forests, woodlands, marshlands and wildlife surrounding Gregg Lake" and to "promote the responsible and equitable use and enjoyment of Gregg Lake by property owners and town residents". Membership is open "to any person or persons who have a strong and vital interest in the conservation of Gregg Lake and its watershed" (Article VI).

The GLA consists of about 43 member families, most of whom are seasonal residents. Several families, however, are year-round. Several of the homes on or near the lake are more than a century old. Many are owned by generations of the same family who, like their predecessors, seek out the lake environment for its beauty, peace and quiet, and natural wildlife. Given that the bulk of the membership is seasonal, however, does not minimize the concerns of the members. In fact, GLA members voted unanimously at the annual meeting on June 16, 2012 to act as a group and petition to intervene (with two abstentions but none opposed).

(2) The interest of the Gregg Lake Association will not be adequately protected by other parties.

GLA members articulated several concerns regarding the Antrim Wind Energy project. Foremost is the effect of the sound of the turbines during various weather and wind conditions, and how that sound will be heard across the lake at various locations and times, and how it might impact families both outdoors and within their homes. GLA members also expressed concerns related but not limited to: prevention of invasive plant species during construction of roads to the turbines;

changes in water quality from road construction run-off and the impact on wildlife as well as watersheds that empty into Gregg Lake, Willard Pond and North Branch stream; and protection of inland Atlantic white cedar wetlands adjacent to the project area during and after road construction. These issues are of critical concern, even to seasonal homeowners, and might not be addressed by those who do not own property directly on or near the lake.

(3) The intervention of the Gregg Lake Association will be in the interest of justice and will not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings by allowing the intervention.

The intervention of the Gregg Lake Association will be in the interest of justice and will not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings by allowing the intervention. GLA members are stakeholders in the wind farm project and would like to participate in the proceedings as respectful members of the public with a unique perspective, that of homeowners directly on or close to Gregg Lake.
