





I. The Application.

On January 31, 2012, Antrim Wind Energy, LLC (Applicant) filed an Application for a Certificate of Site and Facility (Application). The Applicant petitions the Site Evaluation Committee (Committee) for a Certificate of Site and Facility (Certificate) in order to construct and operate a renewable energy facility in the Town of Antrim, Hillsborough County, consisting of not more than 10 wind turbines each having a nameplate capacity of not more than 3 megawatts (MW) for a total nameplate capacity of 30 MW (Facility). The Vice-Chair of the Committee accepted the Application as administratively complete on March 5, 2012, and a Subcommittee was appointed to review the Application as provided in RSA 162-H:6-a, III and RSA 162-H:4, V (Subcommittee).

II. Nature and Location of the Facility and Ancillary Facilities.

The Facility is proposed to be located on and adjacent to property at 354 Keene Road (N.H. Route 9) and includes approximately 1,850 acres of private lands leased to the Applicant. The lands occupy the area in Antrim from Route 9, southward to the east summit of Tuttle Hill, and to the north flank of Willard Mountain to the west. The Facility is proposed to be constructed primarily on a ridgeline that starts approximately 0.75 miles south of N.H. Route 9 and runs south southwest, for approximately 2.5 miles. The Facility is proposed to consist of 10 wind turbines with a maximum nameplate capacity of not more than 3 MW each. The Applicant has notified the Committee that it has selected and intends to construct 10 Acciona AW-116 3MW Turbines (AW-116-3000). Each turbine will consist of a tower, a nacelle, and a 3 blade rotor. The total turbine height from foundation to blade tip will be approximately 492 feet.

In addition, the Facility as proposed would consist of approximately 4 miles of new gravel surface roads within the project area, a joint electrical collector system consisting of both underground and overhead collection lines, an interconnection substation and an operations and maintenance building of approximately 3,000 square feet. As part of its Application, the Applicant has requested the Site Evaluation Committee to grant a subdivision of the land upon which the interconnection substation will be sited so that the property can be transferred to Public Service Company of New Hampshire (PSNH) who will own and operate the substation.

The Applicant proposes to interconnect to an existing PSNH 115 kV electric transmission line through the proposed interconnection substation which will be constructed adjacent to the PSNH L-163 115 kV electric transmission line. If the Facility is certificated, the Applicant expects completion of construction to occur on or before September 30, 2014.

III. Parties to the Adjudicative Proceedings.

The public will be represented in these proceedings by duly appointed Counsel for the Public, Peter C.L. Roth, Senior Assistant Attorney General. The parties to the

adjudicative proceedings are: the Applicant, A LLC; the Town of Antrim; the Antrim Planning Antrim Conservation Commission; the Conservation Commission; the Harris Conservation Education; the Industrial W Group; the Appalachian Mountain Club; abutting land owners (Brenda and Mark Scha Dooley Longgood, and Clark Craig, Jr.); intervenors resident in the north branch area (Richard and Lorraine Block, Robert Cleland Law, Elsa Voelcker, James Hankard, Samuel Apkarian, and Clifton Burdette); Katharine Sullivan; Robert Edwards and Mary E. Allen Audubon Society of New Hampshire.

Pot grower busted

Craig P. Desautels, 35, of Antrim was arrested on Saturday, August 11 for an illegal grow of marijuana.

According to the Antrim police log, and Officer Brian S. Antrim Police Sgt. Sean Cavanaugh received an anonymous tip about Desautel's grow. He then secured a search warrant, the assistance of Deering and Peterborough Police Departments, Sgt. Cavanaugh and other Antrim officers arrived at Salmon Brook Road to execute the warrant.

The Police seized 42 marijuana plants being grown in and two plastic baggies of marijuana equaling one ounce. Also found and seized hydroponic growing equipment and marijuana paraphernalia, including seeds and pipes.

Officer Storro said he will be charged with Class B Felony for the grow, and a Class A Misdemeanor for Possession. He pointed out that the County Attorney will be handling the case and the charges could be dropped to a Class A Misdemeanor, depending on his decision.

Desautel was released on \$10,000 Personal Recognizance.

Officer Storro said Desautel was renting his place of residence, therefore the owner of the property will not be charged.

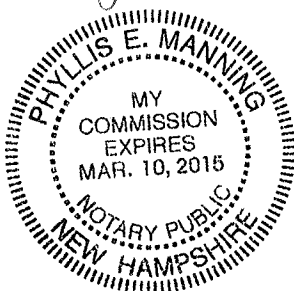

Bridge

Italy defeated the United States in the 1965 world team championship staged in Buenos Aires, Argentina, but the American team did well at both tables on this deal.

At the first table, the U.S. East-West pair got to three spades on the bidding shown. The Italian South could have made three diamonds, but he was denied the opportunity to bid it by the American pair's pre-emptive tactics.

West should have gone down one, but the defense slipped.

North led the queen of diamonds and continued with a diamond to South's king. South then played a third diamond, on which West discarded a heart as North

ruffed with the jack.

North returned a low heart to South's ace, and South led a fourth round of diamonds. West discarded a club as dummy ruffed with the six, and a trump lead from dummy allowed West to claim the rest of the tricks after the king appeared.

At the second table, where B. Jay Becker and Dorothy Hayden were seated North-South for the U.S., the bidding took a dramatic turn:

	East	South	West	North
Pass	1♦	1♠	Pass	
Pass	2♦	Pass	Pass	
2♠	Pass	Pass	3♦	
Pass	3NT!			

Mrs. Hayden's three-notrump call, though highly unusual, was well-judged. With the expected low-spade lead — assuming West had the ace, which seemed likely — she could count nine tricks in notrump.

West led the queen of spades, and Mrs. Hayden, thanks to her bold bid, eventually finished with 10 tricks to net the American team a gain of 770 points. It is true that, with the jack of spades in the North hand, three notrump could not be defeated with any lead, but getting there was nevertheless a coup of the first order.
