**Re: Jericho Mountain Wind Project
Motion for Declaratory Ruling**

Dear Chairman Burack:

As you know, my law firm, Brennan, Caron, Lenehan & Iacopino, has acted as outside counsel to the New Hampshire Site Evaluation Committee ("Committee") with respect to numerous applications for Certificates of Site and Facility over the past fourteen years. We have also assisted the Committee when dealing with issues that have been raised in other contexts, such as requests for exemptions from certificates, requests for modifications of outstanding certificates and requests for jurisdictional advice. Additionally, I was involved in the efforts of the Site Evaluation Committee to promulgate administrative regulations and have testified before the Legislature with regard to proposed statutory amendments.

It is my understanding that the Committee recently received a Motion for Declaratory Ruling from Jericho Power, LLC, regarding the proposed Jericho Mountain Wind Project in Berlin, New Hampshire. The purpose of this letter is to advise you that our office is available, ready, willing and able to represent the Committee with respect to the recently filed Motion if, in fact, the Committee deems it necessary and appropriate to hire outside counsel for this purpose.

Generally, the applicant or party seeking the Committee's action has been responsible for the payment of our fees. See, RSA 162-H: 10, V. In the past, our bills have been presented to the Chairman of the Committee or Subcommittee for approval, and then forwarded to the applicant for payment. To the best of my knowledge, that system has worked well and I do not believe that there has ever been an issue raised by any applicant regarding the amount of fees charged by my Firm.
