Re: Docket 2013-02: Wild Meadows Wind Application of Atlantic Wind, LLC

Dear Vice Chair Ignatius:

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the results of two decisions taken this week¹ by the Selectboards in the Towns of Alexandria and Danbury that we believe materially affect representations made by Atlantic Wind, LLC regarding community support for its project. The decisions are as follows:

Alexandria (Tuesday, January 7, 2014): The Selectboard agreed to abide by the majority wishes of its residents and send a letter to Atlantic Wind, LLC and the Committee asserting the Town's rejection of any proposed agreement including the PILOT agreement. The Selectboard previously sent a letter² to the Committee following a March town vote asserting the Town's opposition to the project.

Danbury (Wednesday, January 8, 2014): The Selectboard agreed to abide by the majority wishes of its residents and send a letter to the Committee asserting the Town's opposition to the Project. This action was taken after the results of a ballot were recorded showing substantial opposition (2:1 opposed) to the project by registered voters.

The Selectboards in the Towns of Bristol, Bridgewater and Grafton are also on record strongly opposing the project based on feedback by their residents.
