I have attended various information meetings in the past regarding the Wild Meadows Wind Farm project and have felt greatly disappointed in the short-sightedness of those opposed to the project. The NH Windwatch group that attends meetings have been harrassing, rude, and manipulative at meetings so that only their side is presented. Representatives from Iberdrola have not been fairly treated.
