To Whom It May Concern:

I support the Wild Meadows Wind Farm as a new source of renewable energy equivalent to the needs of 30,000 New Hampshire homes.

We are still recovering from this recession, and we need jobs in this area. The Wild Meadows Wind Farm is good for our local economy, and will create up to 300 jobs at the peak of construction, a handful of highly-skilled permanent jobs, and it will contribute about \$1.6 million annually to the local community.

I support efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and fight climate change, and the Wild Meadows Wind Farm will reduce CO2 emissions by approximately 340 million pounds per year, equivalent to burning 17.4 million gallons of gasoline, making our air cleaner and reducing our impact on climate change.

I think the wind turbines are beautiful and don't think they are a negative part of the viewscape. The project is a way to diversify our local economy. The studies I have seen show that wind farms do not affect property values.

The Wild Meadows Wind Farm developer, Iberdrola Renewables, has already built two projects in New Hampshire and things have turned out well there. For Wild Meadows, Iberdrola Renewables listened to the community's concerns and has reduced the number of turbines by 38% while maintaining the same amount of clean energy production.
