To the New Hampshire Site Evaluation Committee;

While the applicant has apparently not communicated the decision made to abandon the Wild Meadows industrial wind project with the committee, I want to be sure it's a part of the official record.

I do not have the press release issued by Iberdrola on May 27, 2014, but perhaps if the committee requested a copy of the original from Art Sasse, Paul Copleman or Ed Cherian they would forward a copy for the public records.

I would ask that the members of the Site Evaluation Committee also take note of the date of the Wild Meadows Wind project being pulled from the ISO-NE interconnection queue: March 12, 2014. The day after the towns of Alexandria and Danbury (along with neighboring Hebron) voted overwhelmingly against allowing the project to destroy their towns and also to elevate their own constitutional rights above the claimed "rights" of any corporation (March 11, 2014), the corporate decision-makers decided to abandon the project. The fact that they also decided to disrespect the people of New Hampshire by not notifying the Site Evaluation Committee or the unwilling host towns speaks volumes to the ethics of the Iberdrola corporate leadership.

I respectfully request that docket 2013-02 be removed from the "current projects" section of any and all official records in recognition of the announcement from Iberdrola spokesmen that Wild Meadows wind will not be further pursued.
