RE: Rules and Procedures

Dear Members of the Site Evaluation Committee:

My name is William Jolly. I have been a resident and property owner in the Town of Groton, Grafton Co., for seventeen years. Since moving here from Boston in 1998, I have contributed to my adopted home of New Hampshire as both a business owner and a Civil Servant. I love it here. I worry about my adopted home and the toll that foreign-national corporations (registered in the business-sheltering state of Delaware) are having on Groton and similar communities.

My seven year old daughter and I live on land that is surrounded by the topography proposed for development by EDPR, a "green" energy company that is Portuguese, but hides its corporate shells in Delaware. I am an abutter of the property that EDPR wishes to use for an industrial-wind complex - both by virtue of a common boundary and the impact such development would have on my property (per the state definition). I have found that over the years, EDPR's representatives have been deceptive, dismissive, and arrogant in every dealing I have had with them. Obviously, a well capitalized firm such as EDPR, with management and legal representation that lacks a moral compass, is in a position to exert gargantuan influence upon the SEC if there are not rules in place to protect the interests of the vast numbers of people in communities where the average annual income is comparable to the monthly - and sometimes weekly- salaries of their adversaries.

Article twelve of our State Constitution instructs the government to protect the PEOPLE of New Hampshire by virtue of reciprocity (protection in exchange for taxes). Over the past seventeen years, I have paid more than my fair share of taxes, and now I need protection from unreasonable development. That protection should come from the SEC. As things stand now with regard to becoming an intervener on my family's behalf, I simply cannot afford it. The costs of expert witnesses, tests, cross examination, review of documents, counsel, etc. is far beyond my means financially, and beyond my scope of knowledge to handle personally. Without the SEC acting as a leveler of the playing field, I will lose the quiet enjoyment of my home, and by virtue of anticipated declining value, my life's savings. Not that we should be expected to move to make way for commercial interests, but I will be unable to sell my home for enough money to move to a better location. We are already seeing this from the Groton Wind complex.

I ask that you create an atmosphere, by virtue of well crafted rules, in keeping with the rule of reciprocity, and protect the people of New Hampshire before protecting the commercial interests of gargantuan corporations.
