Dear SEC Committee Members.

I am writing to you today regarding the proposed Sea 3-facility expansion in Newington. I believe that New Hampshire deserves to have access to safe, less-expensive American-produced propane, and we need the Sea-3 expansion project to manage it. I am asking for your approval of the exemption that will allow Sea-3 to begin construction on this state of the art facility that will benefit so many of us in New Hampshire.

It is no accident that 77,000 households in New Hampshire rely on propane for heating their homes. It is cost-effective, clean-burning, and has been handled safely for years. Now Sea-3 wants to use a reliable and cheaper domestic supply shipped by rail to a dedicated unloading facility. The Site Evaluation Committee has in its possession a safety study of the project performed by Sebago Technics, and this study discovered no reasons that this project could not deliver propane safely using the rail lines. The town of Newington's Planning and Zoning Board have already approved Sea-3's expansion proposal, and thus this project should move forward without further delay.

New Hampshire residents' pocketbooks should not be held hostage by a few noisy Portsmouth activists who couldn't even come up with a valid reason that this facility should not be operational. Their only argument was quickly disproved, and the Sea-3 expansion project has met every applicable safety and legal requirement. There is no real reason for this project to be delayed any longer. The benefits are clear: safer, cheaper, and domestically-produced propane is available to New Hampshire now. All of New Hampshire benefits as soon as it is done. We need a yes vote from you so this project can get started.
