- 1 Q. Please state your name and address.
- 2 A. Stephen J. Haight, 15 Toftree Lane, Dover, NH 03820.
- 3 Q. How are you employed?
- 4 A. I work for Haight Engineering, PLLC, which I own.
- 5 Q. What is your educational background and qualifications.
- 6 A. I hold a hold a Bachelor of Science Degree and I am licensed by the State of New
- 7 Hampshire as a professional engineer.
- 8 Q Have you been retained by SEA-3, Inc.?
- 9 A. Yes.
- 10 Q. What were you retained to do?
- 11 A. I was hired to prepare an application for site plan approval and related site plans for
- submittal to the Town of Newington Planning Board in connection with SEA-3's plan to increase
- its rail capacity. My job also included preparing and filing the necessary permit applications
- with the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services to construct the proposed
- improvements.
- 16 Q. I'm showing you a document that's been marked SJH Exhibit 1, can you identify
- 17 this document?

- 1 A. This is a copy of the SEA-3 site plan that I prepared, last revised on May 16, 2014,
- 2 consisting of 8 sheets.
- 3 Q. Was this site plan ultimately approved by the Newington Planning Board?
- 4 A. Yes it was.
- 5 Q. During the Town of Newington's site plan approval process did you attend a
- 6 meeting of the Rockingham County Planning Commission's Developments of Regional
- 7 Impact Committee?
- 8 A. Yes.
- 9 Q. I'm now showing you a document that's been marked SJH Exhibit 2, can you
- 10 identify this document?
- 11 A. It's a letter from the Rockingham Planning Commission's Developments of Regional
- 12 Impact Committee to the Town of Newington dated January 10, 2014, offering comments on
- 13 SEA-3's application for site plan approval.
- 14 Q. Does this letter reference the meeting that you attended?
- 15 A. Yes.
- 16 Q. Does this letter make any recommendations as to SEA-3's site?
- 17 A. Yes.
- 18 Q. What does it recommend?
- 19 A. The Committee's letter first makes several recommendations having to do with rail
- traffic and then it makes a recommendation that the Town of Newington engage in post-
- 21 development approval inspections of the site as a means to insure that the site improvements
- were constructed in accordance with NFPA 58.
- 23 Q. What does SEA-3's proposed expansion consist of?

- 1 A. The expansion will upgrade the existing railroad siding, install a new siding with five
- 2 new discharge pads to accommodate up to ten additional rail cars, install three 90,000 gallon
- 3 above-ground storage tanks, compressors, pumps, drying towers, a mechanical building to house
- 4 the refrigeration equipment and associated condensers and piping. These improvements will
- 5 allow SEA-3 to increase the amount of propane that it can offload from rail cars and store in the
- 6 refrigerated existing tanks on site.
- 7 Q. Where on SEA-3's facility will these improvements be located?
- 8 A. Almost all of the improvements will be located on SEA-3's Lot 14/2, which is to the east
- 9 of the rail line, closest to the river. The only improvement located on the other lot will be the
- pipeline leading to the refrigerated storage tanks. The new rail siding and discharge pads will be
- installed on property of Pan Am Railways that SEA-3 will lease. This will be a narrow strip of
- land alongside the existing rail line, directly between SEA-3's two lots.
- 13 Q. Who determined the location and layout of the proposed improvement as shown on
- 14 the Site Plan?
- 15 A. This was determined by SEA-3 in coordination with Haight Engineering, PLLC and was
- modified as suggested by the Town of Newington's reviewing engineers.
- 17 Q. How would you describe the existing areas where these proposed improvements will
- 18 be located?
- 19 A. The area is a relatively flat, gravel-surfaced industrial area surrounded by a chain link
- security fence.
- 21 Q. Is there anything located in this area now?

- 1 A. Yes. There is the existing railroad siding with three discharge pads, each offloading two
- 2 railcars, LP Gas offloading equipment, an LP flare, a number of fire suppression nozzles and a
- 3 small wooden equipment shed.
- 4 Q. Will SEA-3 be making any changes to the existing storm drainage system?
- 5 A. Yes. The existing drainage catch basin at the southeast corner of the fenced in area will
- 6 be replaced with a deep sump catch basin and the existing drainage swale leaving the fenced in
- 7 area will be reconstructed.
- 8 Q. Will there be any other changes to the site?
- 9 A. Yes. There will be a six foot high earthen berm constructed on the southerly side of the
- 10 parcel within the fenced area.
- 11 **Q.** Will any of the improvements take place off the site?
- 12 A. Yes. As mentioned the new rail siding and five new discharge pads, accommodating ten
- rail cars, with associated piping will be installed on Pan Am Railways' property, adjacent to the
- existing rail line.
- 15 Q. Will the proposed improvements result in any adverse change to existing dust,
- 16 **erosion or run-off conditions?**
- 17 A. No.
- 18 Q. Did these proposed changes necessitate having to obtain any permits or approvals
- 19 from the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services?
- 20 A. Yes. The project required an Alteration of Terrain Permit and a Shoreland Impact Permit
- 21 from the New Hampshire DES.
- 22 Q. Have these been obtained?

- 1 A. Yes. NHDES Alteration of Terrain Permit Number AoT-0695 was obtained on March
- 2 21, 2014, and Shoreland Impact Permit No. 2014-00105 was obtained on January 22, 2014.
- 3 Q. I am showing you what's been marked as Exhibit SJH 3, can you identify what it
- 4 contains?
- 5 A. Yes, it contains copies of the Alteration of Terrain Permit No. AoT-0695 and Shoreland
- 6 Impact Permit No. 2014-00105.
- 7 Q. Did you have any communications with the New Hampshire Department of
- 8 Environmental Services' Air Resources Division regarding the timing for obtaining an
- 9 **updated Permit to Operate?**
- 10 A. Yes, I had a phone call with the Department to discuss the planned improvements.
- 11 Q. What were you told?
- 12 A. I was told that SEA-3 currently has a Permit to Operate Identification Number
- 13 3301500002, which includes the two refrigerated storage tanks, the flare, and an emergency
- generator. I was told that SEA-3 will need to update its current permit to operate when the
- 15 construction is completed. At that time, SEA-3 will need to file a formal written request to
- update its Permit to Operate with Sheila Rydel of the Air Resources Division.
