PETITION FOR INTERVENTION BY MARY E. ALLEN

NOW COMES the Petitioner and respectfully petitions the New Hampshire Site

Evaluation Committee ("the SEC" or "the Committee") to grant leave to intervene in these

proceedings pursuant to NH Code of Administrative Rules, Site 202.11 and RSA 541-A:32.

In support of this petition, Ms. Allen states as follows:

- 1 For the past 40 years, the Petitioner has been a resident, taxpayer and voter in the Town of Antrim, New Hampshire.
- This Petition is filed in response to an application filed by Antrim Wind Energy LLC ("AWE") on or about October 2, 2015, seeking the SEC's certificate of site and facility related to a proposed wind energy project (the "Proposal") proposed to be sited in the western part of Antrim, New Hampshire, the same site which was the subject of a 2012 docket before the SEC (current Docket 2014-05).
- 3 Petitioner has previously shown interest in this matter as an intervenor in prior proceedings for Antrim Wind Energy LLC and was twice granted intervention status in those proceedings.
- 4 Petitioner was a 12-year member of the Antrim Board of Adjustment (serving two years as chairman); served as an alternative on he Antrim Planning Board; served as a

member of the Antrim Planning Board 's Ad Hoc committee, which authored the town's first large-scale wind energy zoning ordinance; served on two Master Plan committees and the town's Capital Improvement Committee; and she authored the sign regulations for the Antrim Zoning Ordinance. She also served multiple three-year terms as a Supervisor of the Checklist.

In addition, she was elected to and served seven years on the 13-member

Contoocook Valley School Board as one of Antrim's two representatives. She was chairman

of the school board's Energy Committee and, as a member of the district's building

committee, was directly involved in completing a \$4 million gymnasium renovation project.

Petitioner requests that she be placed in an intervenor group only with Charles Levesque, another Antrim resident also petitioning for intervenor status. Mr. Levesque and the Petitioner have similar interests and evidence to offer the SEC during its adjudicatory process under this docket separate from the interests of other non-abutting Antrim residents.

SUMMARY

- 6 For the foregoing reasons, Petitioner asks leave to intervene pursuant to Site 202.11(b) on the following grounds:
 - This Petition will be served and submitted within the time limits set out in the rule;
 - b. This Petition states facts demonstrating that Petitioner has substantial rights and interests that will be affected by the proceeding; and
 - c. That granting this Petition would serve the interest of justice.

Request for Relief

WHEREFORE, I respectfully request that the SEC issue an order granting my petition for intervention and granting such other and further relief as it deems appropriate.
