The constant pounding and noise associated with this Project has significantly impacted my and my family's ability to enjoy the peace and quiet which we are accustomed to, living on the Bay. Even our beloved pets do not want to go into our back yard on some days due to the loud banging heard on the Bay and through our woodlands.


Eversource thinks it may need extended construction hours but did not offer to the SEC specific reasons for their request. Moreover, the Order rendered was most specific in terms of the construction hours they had to work with. They knew this from the start.

Finally, this is no "Minor Modification." We cannot enjoy our property during the current construction hours of 7:00AM-6:00PM (11 hours!) due to the noise and now they are requesting to extend this and make it worse. We are having a difficult time with the current construction schedule. I would like for you to know that on Saturday morning, September 21, 2019, in the dark hours of early morning around 5:00AM, we were awakened by loud motor sounds, beeping, and roving spotlights invading our bedroom.

I ask the SEC to please convene a hearing to investigate this request from Eversource or flat out deny it all together. We have enough to deal with as the current schedule stands. Thank you.
