

Hi Kurt,

DES concurs that the proposed work to provide additional supplemental protection for the cable near the shore on the east side of Little Bay, as described in Eversource's letter of April 14, 2020, does not require an amendment to DES' recommended conditions included in the SEC's decision of January 31, 2019. This is based on the following understanding: 1) Work is within the previously approved permitted area, 2) work is temporary and of relatively short duration, 3) erosion controls including installation of a turbidity curtain are proposed to be implemented, and 4) work will be conducted in accordance with all applicable conditions in the SEC decision.
