It takes untold years for a complex aquatic ecosystem to evolve. The proposed Eversource Jet-Plowing of Little Bay is fraught with scientific uncertainty -- what precisely will be the amounts of sediment stirred up, what toxic chemicals will be released, how much nitrogen, what plant and animal life will be disrupted?

What might be gained by this jet-plowing? A more convenient route for Eversource. But other routes, perhaps less convenient, are available. The jet-plowing plan may turn portions of the Little Bay into a dead zone. What of the costs to fishermen? Recreational boaters? Shoreline residents? The health of our planet? The Bay is not infinitely resilient. We must not gamble with the viability of waterways. Please do not accept the current plan for Jet-Plowing on Little Bay.
