## OBJECTION to SECOND PARTIALLY COTESTED MOTION FOR PROTECTIVE ORDER AND CONFIDENTIAL TREATMENT

On this 4<sup>th</sup> day of January, 2016, I Margaret Huard, acknowledge the receipt of the above mentioned motion dated 12/31/15, requesting protective order to preserve the confidentiality of information relating to the status, location and distribution of rare, threatened and endangered plants, animals and natural environments.

I hereby object to this motion and request a more specific and reasonable scope limitation to this confidential treatment as follows.

- The applicant is seeking such status because they assert that disclosing such information COULD negatively affect the rare, threatened and endangered plant, animal and natural environments.
- Note 1 of the motion appears to expand the scope of confidentiality from rare, threatened and endangered to ALL plant and animal species and natural communities on or adjacent to the project site.
- The applicant seeks the protection of these rare, threatened and endangered plants, animal and natural environments under the *NH Native Plant Protections Act of 1987*, the *Endangered Species Conservation Act* and the *Endangered Species Act* by maintaining the CONFIDENTIALITY of the existence of these rare, threatened and endangered plant, animal and natural environments.
- CONFIDENTIALITY is not a specific measure to be taken under the above mentioned laws.
- The New Hampshire Heritage Bureau provides, *A Report on Rare Plants, Rare Animals and Endangered Natural Communities* to the public. This report provides information by town regarding rare, threatened and endangered plant, animal and natural environments.
- According to this report, the **New Hampshire Heritage Bureau** claims that "far too many sensitive plants, animals and natural environments are destroyed because people are **unaware of them**."
- Additionally, information on rare, threatened and endangered plant, animal and natural environments for specific property locations are

- It is to this end only, that I agree that such information should be kept ٠ confidential without expressed consent of the landowner.
- It is sheer ignorance, greed, lack of due diligence, lack of knowledge and • insufficient oversight that causes the unnecessary destruction of rare, threatened and endangered plant, animal and natural environments, and not full disclosure.
- The confidential status sought by the applicant actually makes it difficult • to afford the rare, threatened and endangered plant, animal and natural environments proper protection.
- Affording confidential status regarding rare, threatened and endangered • plant, animal and natural environments allow the applicant and their contractors opportunity to exploit and harm rather than protect.

Therefore, I hereby request that if a protective order is made, affording the confidential status sought by the applicant, it should be limited and more specifically defined.
