Dear Ms. Monroe:

I hereby respond and object to the Applicants' effort to limit the scope of my intervention and to combine it with the interventions of other abutting landowners as set forth in the Applicants' Response and Objection to Certain Petitions to Intervene dated February 26, 2016.

I filed a Petition to Intervene on February 2, 2016. In their Intervention Objection, the Applicants did not object to my Petition to Intervene, however, they attempt to limit my participation.

I am an "abutting landowner" to the proposed Northern Pass project. The proposed towers and power lines will be situated on and cross over my properties and will impact the sole access to my home in Deerfield, NH.

My interests will not be sufficiently represented by other abutting property owners. Nor will my interests be sufficiently represented by Counsel for the Public, as my Petition to Intervene is not based on how the Site Evaluation Committee's action will affect the public in general, but on how it will affect my property in particular.

My participation in the proceedings will not be repetitive and will not impede the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings.

I incorporate in this rebuttal valid arguments presented by other Interveners that also pertain to my Petition to Intervene.

I respectfully request the SEC to overrule the Applicants' Response to my petition as an abutting landowner by granting me the right to intervene without the limitations sought by the Applicants. To combine my interests with those of others would limit my procedural rights and would hinder my ability to protect my property effectively, which is my statutory right.
