Re: Rebuttal to Applicants Response and Objection to Certain petitions to Intervene submitted to the SEC on February 26, 2016

Dear Ms. Monroe.

Please enter my/our objection to being denied intervenor status by the Applicant who states that as we are beyond the 100 foot setback we do not meet the criteria for Intervenor status.

Our property is located on land owned by the Percy Summer Club of which I/we are members. We pay property tax on the jointly owned land of the Percy Summer Club on which our property sits to the Town of Stark. I identified the Percy Summer Club in my initial Petition for Intervenor Status.

The Percy Summer Club holds the easement to the ROW that the Applicant is proposing to use as its corridor with high lattice towers for its transmission lines.

The ROW crosses land owned by the Percy Summer Club, of which I/we are members.

The membership of the Percy Summer Club has authorized me to represent our collective interests as an Intervenor.

The members of the Percy Summer Club who own property on Summer Club Road are equally impacted by the proposed transmission line for the same reasons stated in my original petition to Intervene and have requested their names be added to objections to the proposed transmission line through my representation. (Field Rider and Susan Percy, Rhoda Margesson, Ned and Janis Farquhar, Mark Beaven, George and Madelyn Hamilton, Jay and Lynne Espy all of Summer Club Road, Stark, New Hampshire)

Our property sits on the western shore of Christine Lake. The entire lake is protected in perpetuity from development by the Percy Summer Club through the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests and the State of New Hampshire who hold the easement. The southern edge of the lake will be subject to high towers visible along the ridge and to the east from Milan from our front porches and from the lake.

The scenic beauty of Christine Lake and it's surrounding forests, mountains and trails, will be significantly impacted from all viewsheds, both on the water and from vistas in the mountains.

The environmental impact to the Lake and the Kauffmann Forest is immeasurable.

We clearly are landowners over which this project passes, abutters, and an interested party to the proposed route for the transmission line. I/we are the only representatives of Christine Lake and its surrounding environment who can adequately represent this area due to our ownership privileges. I/we respectfully request Intervenor status.
