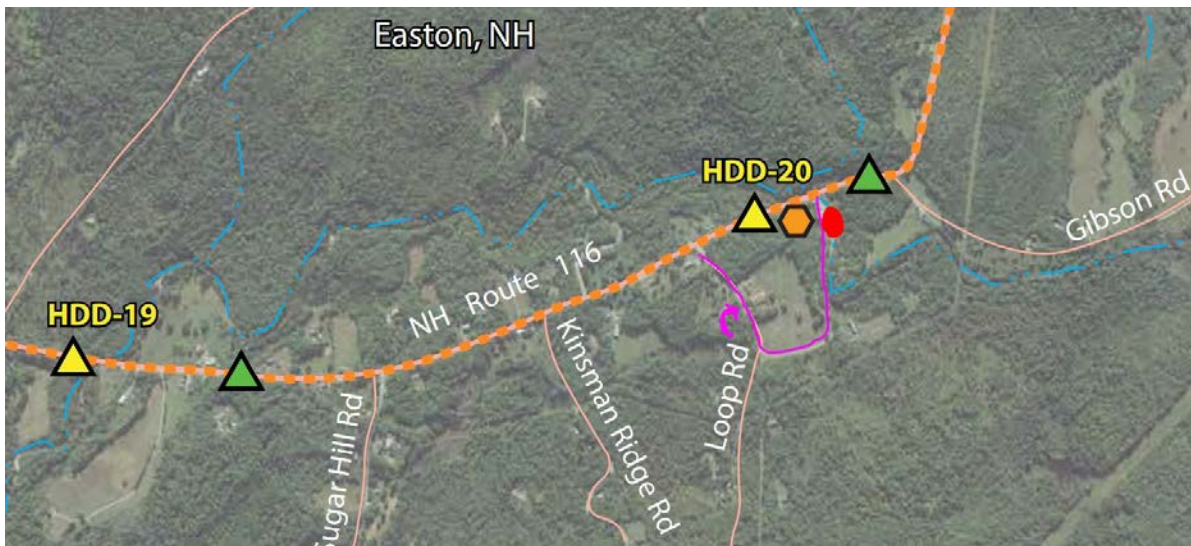

Re: CHANGE OF INTERVENOR GROUP AFFILIATION, SEC DOCKET NO. 2015-06

Dear Ms. Monroe,

Yesterday, May 4, 2017, I transferred my ownership of 28 Academy Street #1, Franconia, N.H. This was the rental property interest abutting Route 116 for which intervenor status was granted to me by the SEC. I was placed in the Bethlehem-Plymouth Abutting Property Owners group. I pre-filed testimony on December 30, 2016 under my name alone as a pro se intervenor.

Please change my intervenor affiliation to the Bethlehem-Plymouth Non-Abutting Property Owners group. My qualifying property interest is my residence at 162 Loop Road, Easton. The eastern boundary of this property is approximately 250' from Route 116, Easton, the proposed underground route, between two HDD drilling sites, #19 and #20. During construction, the shortest entrance to and exit from my residential property would require travel along Rte. 116 for 6.5 miles south to Rte. 112, also a proposed underground route, or 1 mile north to Sugar Hill Road, followed by lengthy detours to reach the places I must commonly visit (grocery store, post office, gas station, etc.). With ten HDD drilling sites and one micro-tunnel site proposed along Rte. 116's eleven miles and an anticipated disruption period of at least two construction-season years, there would be a significant adverse impact upon my daily life from traffic delays and detours, not to mention other adverse impacts (noise, dirt, blasting) from extended construction so close to my residential property.
