

Dear Ms. Monroe:

I respectfully request to intervene in the SEC's proceedings under Docket No. 2015-06 relating to the proposed Northern Pass transmission line. Per the SEC's regulations I am sending this request to you, with copies to the SEC's Distribution list as noted in the "dd" above.

My particular rights and other substantial interests that may be affected by the SEC's Northern Pass proceedings include the following.

I am a walking-disabled low-income senior. I live in my home of 30 years, on a portion of Creampoke Road in Stewartstown, where they want to bury part of the Northern Pass line. This is not a deeded road. It is a road right-of-way with abutters on both sides owning to the center of the road, both above and below ground.

My well is a few feet, and downhill, from where they want to dig/blast/bury the line. I have read the EIS, and know that my water supply is likely to be contaminated, disrupted, or destroyed. I am not physically or financially able to be driven out of my home, nor do I want to be forced to move elsewhere.

In addition to having no right to take private property, letters to me from Northern Pass have indicated that there is an existing transmission line right-of-way on, or adjacent to, my property. There is indeed an overhead electric wire and telephone wire along the east side of my yard - the Creampoke Road side. Those wires go from a pole at the southeast corner of my lawn, off to the north via Creampoke and County Roads. However, there is no power or phone line from that corner south - i.e., even if there is/was a right-of-way to my corner, it ends there and does not continue over North Hill Road where they also want to bury the line.

I have wetland on the north and east sides of my property. There is considerable ledge along these roads where they plan to bury the line, and I am not alone in having a water well, gas line and home in jeopardy.

Also, just above me on County Road, which they also plan to dig up, there is place where the road has migrated slightly over many decades, resulting in the fact that an old graveyard is now actually under the roadbed. My family has been up here since the turn of the 19th century. I have no idea who is now buried under County Road, but nobody should have their ancestors dug up for this intrusive, invasive, and destructive project.
