We respectfully request to intervene in the SEC's proceedings under Docket No. 2015-06 relating to the proposed Northern Pass transmission line. Per the SEC's regulations, we are sending this request to you, with copies to the SEC's distribution list for this proceeding as noted in the CC below.


Our particular rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other substantial interests that may be affected by the SEC's Northern Pass proceedings include the following:

1. Lines will go directly across our property. We own property at 75 Newell Lane, Whitefield NH 03598. This property includes 78 acres of land extending for a sizeable distance along Forest Lake Road. We understand that the proposed Northern Pass transmission line will go directly across our property. On this basis, we understand that we have statutory basis to intervene.
2. Negative impact to the value and enjoyment of the property The siting of the proposed Northern Pass transmission on our property, including the very tall towers and the high voltage transmission lines, may cause very significant loss in the value of the property and also will negatively impact the quiet enjoyment we have had of the property. Obviously, the lines will be visible from our property and anyone planning to visit us will need to drive on Forest Lake Road directly under the transmission lines.

Our interests as property owner are direct and substantial and distinct from the interests of the public at large.
