

Dear Ms. Monroe:

I respectfully request to intervene in the SEC's proceedings under Docket No. 2015-06 relating to the proposed Northern Pass transmission line.

Per the SEC's regulations, I am sending this request to you, with copies to the SEC's distribution list for this proceeding as noted in the "cc" below.

My particular rights, duties, and substantial interests that may be affected by the SEC's Northern Pass proceedings include the following:

First, our family home is located on Route 116 in Easton, on the Northern Pass proposed burial route. Our house is a historic post and beam constructed building, with a fieldstone foundation, built around 1850 by a member of the Kendall family. In fact, the brook bisecting our property is named Kendall Brook.

As was the custom in that time, houses were built close to the roads. Our house is just 70 feet from the Route 116 ROW. And in addition to the Kendall Brook, our property is bordered by the Ham Branch River. We take the stewardship of our portion of these waterways seriously and strive to keep them pristine.

Our distinct interests include:

1) The close proximity of the proposed HVDC lines to our home:

a) The heavy construction equipment and disturbance of the earth will result in a high probability of damage to an old stone foundation.

b) The controversial subject of health issues caused by HVDC lines in such close proximity, whether valid or not, will forever and significantly deflate the value of our property.

2) The waterways and wetlands crossings.

We have a substantial interest in the potential harm and environmental issues caused by the disturbance of boring under the 2 waterways on our property one of which is just 50 feet from our house, as well as the at least 6 other waterways the proposed lines would have to cross along the Route 116 portion of the proposed route potentially affecting adversely the ecology of the watershed of the Easton Valley.
