I request to intervene in the SEC's proceedings under Docket No. 2015-06 relating to the proposed Northern Pass transmission line. Per the SEC's regulations, I am sending this request to you, with copies to the SEC's distribution list for this proceeding as noted in the "cc" below.

My particular rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other substantial interests that may be affected by the SEC's Northern Pass proceedings include the following:

1) I am a resident of Littleton and enjoy the surrounding communities for personal fulfillment and recreation purposes. The disruption by Northern Pass as proposed will greatly interfere with the beauty of the area that now is such a treasure of wilderness landscapes. The enjoyment includes immersion in these areas by roadways and trails, and also the images by photography and canvas artwork, as well as contemplation of the beautiful environment that brings great serenity by its natural healing.

2) My business serves Grafton and Coos county residents and visitors. The impact of Northern Pass of reduced tourism and resultant economic depression can adversely impact the economics of my business as well.

3) Noteworthy also is the nature of my business, Bright Day Psychology PLLC. The well being of people is my concern. People already are traumatized by the threat of Northern Pass and, if it were to be approved, then the resulting economic and psychological damage will be even more severe. These traumas are unnecessary and could be avoided if the permit is denied or if full and proper burial would be required.
