Dear Ms. Monroe,

We respectfully request to intervene in the SEC's proceedings under Docket 2015-06 relating to the proposed Northern Pass transmission line in Stark, NH. Per the SEC's regulations, we are sending this request to you, with copies to the SEC distribution list for this proceeding as of this date and noted in the "cc" list below.

We purchased our property on Percy Road in Stark to be used for family recreational purposes. This includes us, our children, and grandchildren. As a condition of sale I contacted Northern Pass in order to determine if the PSNH ROW behind us would be used for Northern Pass. A Northern Pass representative responded to me, directing my attention to a route map. After the sale went through, I found out the map was already out of date when they directed me too it! Basically I feel Northern Pass lied to me. Because of this I invested all our savings that was earmarked for achieving our New Hampshire "dream". Little did I know this would in fact become a nightmare.

Our particular rights, duties, privileges, immunities or other substantial interest that may be affected by the SEC's Northern Pass proceedings include, but are not limited to the following:

1. Health and Safety – Our property is located less than 400' from the PSNH Right-of Way (ROW), known as the Coos Loop. It is important to note that there is a Natural Gas pipeline within this ROW, placing me and my family fully within the "incineration zone". Also, there have been findings that link childhood leukemia to exposure to high voltage EMF levels.
2. Property Value – Current poles are below the tree line, while the proposed towers are easily visible above the tree line. This will degrade our land's value to the extent where it will be "worthless".
3. Reasonable expectation to enjoy our property – We enjoy camping and hiking on the property, and HAD plans to build a camp some day.
4. Unreasonable use of the ROW – I believe the co-location of Northern Pass with the Coos Loop upgrades AND the Natural Gas pipeline leads to a dangerous and potentially deadly unreasonable use of the ROW.

We feel that no other individual, agency, or organization could articulate or represent our specific interests and concerns in the proceedings as well as we can.

Therefore we respectfully request that the Site Evaluation Committee:

1. Grant our Petition to Intervene; and
2. Grant such other and further relief as may be just.
